By United Press. WASHINGTON, Jan. 27.—China was warned today by the United States to agree on a stable govern-ment able to protect American lives and interests. This is a prior condi-tion to negotiations to the new equal treaties and abrogation of extraterri-torial privileges, under which the United States maintains the court and troops in China, according to a state

ment by Secretary of State Kellogg, The contents of the statement were fully summarized by the exclusive United Press dispatch yesterday, in advance of presentation to the press. Kellogg quoted from and reaffirmed his previous statement that this gov-ernment will "negotiate the release of extraterritorial rights as soon as China is prepared to provide protection by law, and through court to American citizens, their rights and
