#### MEAD'S ART AND NOVELTY IS DESTROYED BY FIRE

Boys Sleeping in Rear of Building Have Narrow Escape. Owner Was Preparing to Move Stock Today to New Location. Extent of Damage Not Yet Fully Determined

Fire thought to have been caused by spontaneous combustion almost destroyed the stock of J. H. Mead, art and novelty store, at 115 Main street, Ranger, at 6:30 this morning, and did slight damage to the building, owned by the Bohning interests.

The fire department responded immediately and Chief Murphy said that as they rounded the corner by the Majestic hotel, that the smoke pouring from the building resembled an oil well fire.

Both buildings were full of smoke and the firemen kicked down the door at 117 Main street, which is separated from Mead's by a beaverboard wall, one of the few that are in the fire district in Ranger and which was to be removed.

Chief Murphy said he thought the fire caught behind the partition, and that they fought the fire back to the rear end of the building, when something blew up and threw the fire back to the front again and completely covered the area they had been fighting.

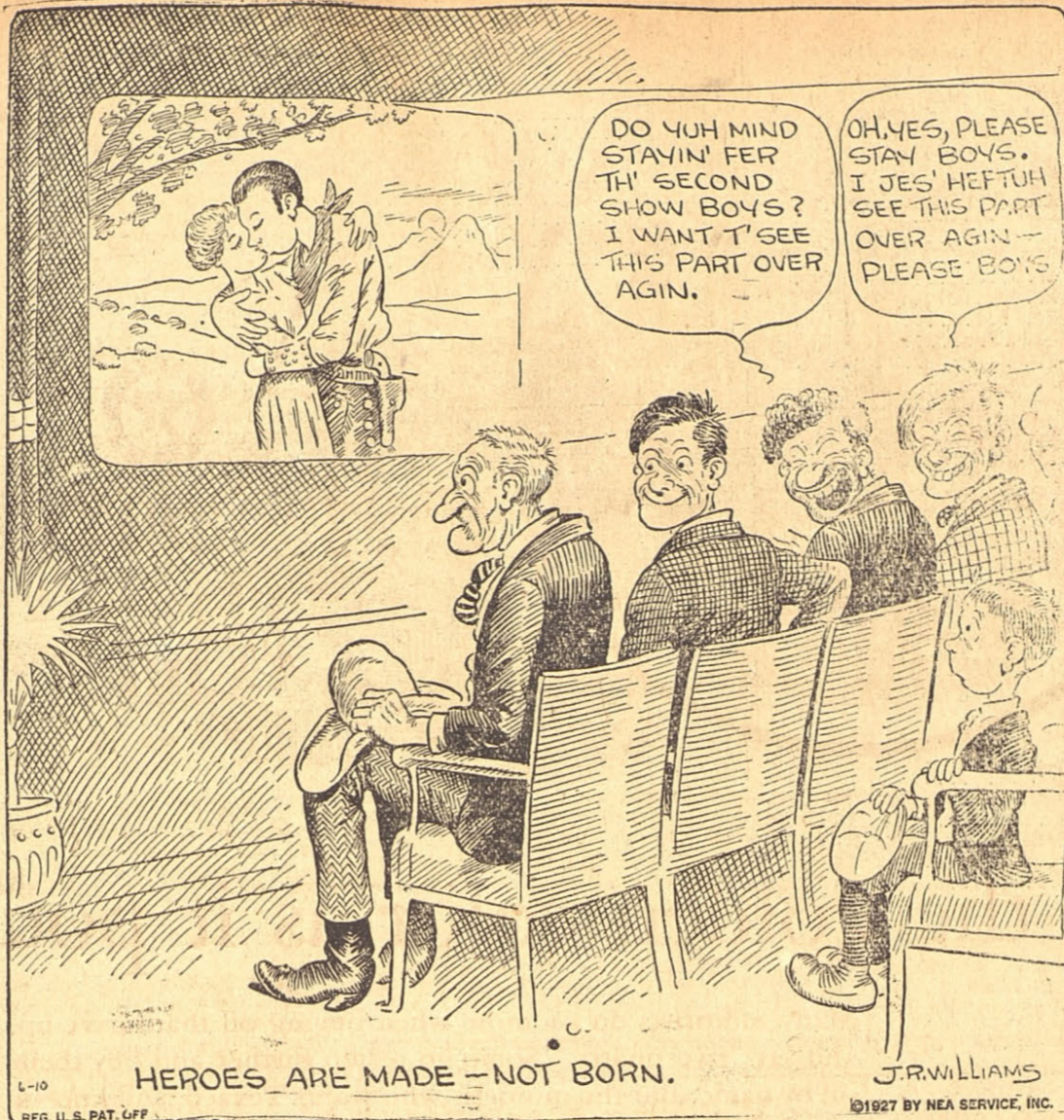

TYPHOID FEVER HITS MOUNTAIN AREA KENTUCKY

By United Press. HAZARD, Ky., June 10.—A new menace threatened the mountain people of Southeast Kentucky with reports that typhoid fever is spreading through the district ravaged by floods. Extent of damage from torrential rains and torrents more than a week ago was still unknown. The death toll was officially announced as more than 100. Buildings were washed away, crops destroyed and whole families killed in racing flood waters down the mountain sides. Veils are dying out in Persia, it is said. We wonder what the police reporters over there have to say now about a threat.
