The oil and gas industry-those engaged in these lines in West Texas should co-operate in every way possible with the new bureau. It is only through complete co-operation of those engaged in the business and those directing the bureau, that the best results can be obtained. Once functioning the bureau can be of much benefit to those engaged in the oil industry in ways too numerous to mention.

The magic valley of the lower Rio Grande simply can't stay in the background any more.
