Hodges Oak Park Transfers Many To Cooper Ward

Owing to the extremely crowded condition of the ward schools of Ranger, especially Hodges Oak Park, where 94 pupils were enrolled in the first grade, 75 in the second grade and 60 in the third grade on the first day of school, with other rooms proportionately increased, the Ranger independent school board met last night and changed the district school lines.

The board passed an order that all pupils in the fifth, sixth and low seventh grades, living south of Mesquite street and east of South Hodges street, be assigned to Cooper Ward and ordered the superintendent to see that the assignments were abided by.

All pupils in the fourth grade, living south of Mesquite street and east of South Marston street, were also assigned to Cooper school and the superintendent was authorized to arrange for their transfer.

The seventh grade pupils of all schools are to be taken care of at the Ranger High school and one teacher from Hodges Oak Park school is to be transferred to the High school to take care of this grade.

These changes were a natural consequence of the heaviest enrollment the Ranger schools have ever known and it was brought out at this meeting of the board that practically all of the surplus pupils with the exception of the usual first graders and primary pupils, were children of newcomers to Ranger.

Plans for putting on a truant officer were also discussed but no definite action was taken on the matter. The resignation of Mrs. Nellie Jones, for many years a teacher in Central Ward, now Hodges Oak Park school, was accepted and Mrs. J. W. A. Cox was appointed to fill the vacancy temporarily.

Dr. J. B. Stackable, city health officer was present at the meeting and made a talk on the importance of vaccination and quarantining and the board instructed Superintendent Holloway to be very careful about admitting pupils to school who might have communicable diseases.

Water Lines Will Be Extended East On Strawn Road

The City Commission of Ranger met in regular session Tuesday night at the City hall, and dispensed with several important matters, paramount of which was the approving of the contract between the city and consulting engineer F. J. Von Zuben, relative to the engineering work for the paving contract.

Plans for financing the extension of water lines east on the Strawn road were also effected.

Chas. Littlejohn appeared before the commission in behalf of the proposed extension of the sewer lines from Spring road to Pershing street, two blocks fronting Strawn road, and stated he thought his block could be financed, as the other block has been financed and is ready to go.

The question of appointing a successor to the late W. A. Ratliff, for the Evergreen cemetery, was discussed but the matter was left open for the present.
