ECHO OF TONG WAR REACHES RANGER COPS; CHINAMAN SOUGHT

One reads quite often of the tong wars of the Chinese in California, and in reading shudders and doubts the truth of the statements. They appear too horrible to believe in this age.

To the police station this morning came a notice from a chief of police of a California city, asking that one Bing Kong, a Chinaman, be apprehended if he comes this way. The notice says that the man sought is a Chinese gunman; that he killed Quon Yen and is a member of the Sue On Tong. The latter statement means that a tong war is in progress or has been in progress, and that Bing Kong, true to his tong killed his man and then disappeared.

AMERICA IS DESCRIBED AS 'THE HAPPY HUNTING GROUND OF DIVORCE'

LONDON, July 1.—America was described as "the happy hunting ground of divorce" and "the home of divorces" by the Rev. A. V. Magee, vicar of St. Mark's church, London, during a discussion of the divorce question by the London Diocesan conference just ended. A resolution was adopted pledging the conference "to adhere to the principle of the indissolubility of Christian marriage."

The Rev. Mr. Magee denounced Lord Buckmaster's bill in parliament for divorce reform, saying it could adequately be described in two titles, "Divorce While You Wait" and "Marriage on Trial for Six Months."

An amendment to the resolution that the conference should pledge itself to adhere "to the teaching of Jesus Christ concerning marriage" was lost.

UNIVERSITY STUDENTS ARE SUSPENDED FOR CHEATING

COLUMBUS, Ohio, July 1.—For alleged cheating in examination last semester twenty-five of thirty Ohio State university students have been suspended, President W. O. Thompson said today. Among the number was Harry A. "Hoge" Workman, crack varsity quarterback, who last fall won nation-wide renown for his forward passes.

Workman's alleged offense took place in a mid-semester examination in a course in economics last May, Dr. Thompson said. The suspension in his case dates from that time and incurs loss of credit for work done all last semester.
