R. L. Henry of Waco and Sterling P. Strong are the klan defenders, Henry in a speech at Fort Worth Saturday announced his membership in the organization and hurled defiance at its detractors. Sterling P. Strong in a speech at Meridian Friday stated that he was the only senatorial candi date who had come to the defense of the klan. Senator Charles E. Culber son offers the strongest condemnation of any of the candidates opposing the klan. He favors an extra session of the legislature to curb the klan before it overthrows the government. Clarence Ousley offers the mildest oppotack on Masonry during the Jackson-Clay presidential composion Clay presidential campaign in 1832, declares that the historical episode served to "admonish us not to stir up hatred against men whose purpose we do not completely know." 


