AMARILLO TRAIN KILLS EASTLAND COUNTY YOUTH

Body of M. G. Rayford Being Shipped Home; Father Unconscious

M. G. Rayford, 23, of Olden, was killed by a train in Amarillo yesterday, according to information reaching the Eastland county sheriff's department, whose services were sought by the Amarillo authorities in locating his relatives.

A telegram from N. S. Griggs & Sons, Amarillo undertakers, to the Eastland county sheriff's office stated, "Young man, M. G. Rayford, killed here today. help us locate his relatives." Policeman Tom Jones, upon receipt of the message, went to Olden and established the fact that the dead boy was the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. Q. Rayford of Olden.

The father gave instructions to have the body sent home and almost immediately took to his bed, ill from the effects of the shock. Friends of the family in Olden stated this morning that the father was in a serious condition, having been uncon-A telegram from N. S. Griggs &



Physiologist Says Hanging Icreases Crime

OXFORD, Eng., Aug. 6.—Capital punishment increases frequency of murder, Dr. James Drever, noted psychologist, told the British Association for the Advancement of Science here

"Not only does capital punishment increase the crime of murder," he said, "but it effects a brutalizing in-

fluence on society at large.
"Problems of all punishments for erime eventually effect society, but the question of whether we can re-form individuals through punishment is a highly arguable one.

Dr. Drever declared that all prison sentences, no matter how short, seriously alter the whole life of the subject and that the restraint of imprisonment, imposed by society as a protective measure to itself, in the long run works in the opposite direction.

He recommended a closer contact between medical and legal methods as a solution to the problem.


