





WHAT they want and what they are likely to get, how-ever, are two entirely different propositions. The congressional idea is that the Washing-tonians ought to be grateful for all they've had done for them. "Yes, we know," groan the Washingtonians, the way all subject peoples do, "but gosh! how we want to be free!"

TT wouldn't be so bad if Congress did a first-class job of city governing but there's room for a lot of improvement. If congressional consent can be secured, the Washingtonians have to stand it, whether they like it or not.
