The crowd which surrounded the gummen and their victims seemed to have been figured as a protection, rather than a menace, by the pair. Officers were on the trail of the pair within ten minutes after the robbery, but the speeding robber car seemed to have disappeared without a trace. All avenues of escape are being watched and word has been flashed to the officers of surrounding cities and coun-ties. Descriptions of the pair are furnished by spectators and officers hope for speedy arrests.
