

Second, there is an egg in the first bill of fare and a little meat or fish in the others. This is for iron which milk lacks.

Third, there is fruit in two meals out of three. This is a good rule to keep in mind all the time. Fresh fruit is best—juice or pulp for very young children. If fresh fruit can not be obtained, dried fruit may be used at one meal and either a little tomato juice or a raw green vegetable such as lettuce in the other. These woods are the watch dogs of the diet. They help to keep off disease.

Fourth, every meal in these ra-

Fourth, every meal in these rations provides for "roughage." In some meals it is supplied by potatoes. In others it is supplied by whole-grain cereal breakfast foods or whole-wheat bread. This means that the food will have enough bulk to prevent constipation.


