Many insurance companies who hay on permit from the state have been do in business in Ranger. This informatio came to light yesterday. By the insurance laws of the state a companies and their agents must have permit before they can do business i this state. Under one system that has been i vogue in Ranger a solicitor would fin people who needed fire protection an who, perlays, could not get it throng the regular agencies. He would go these merchants or whoever they migh be and offer to find them a compan which would write their policies.

The application would then be sent of to an insurance brockering concern in New York city, which in turn, would get the policy written in a company organ ized in New Jersey or some other state in Texas. In case of question both the solicitor \$4 and the insurance company would say at that the solicitor was the agent of the o' insured and not the agent of the insurance company. This statement would we be verified by the cyclence that the agent agreed to find a place where the applicant 4, could buy fire insurance. In case of loss w the insured would have to sute in the state where the company was organized or had a permit to do business. Their w grounds of defense would be that they an

rounds of defense would be that they had no permit or agents in this state; that be permit or agent of the insured, thus defeating efforts to get jurisdiction over them in Texas courts. In each case where such insurance has been written the rate has been very high. Efforts are being made by W. L. Curtis, assistant courty attorney, to have this practice stopped. 




