





St. Louis Would Keep Negroes In Outlined Districts

By United Press

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 20.—Establishment of exclusive negro residential sections of this city to take care of the colored population's 50 per cent increase since 1920 has been approved by the 375 members of the St. Louis real estate exchange.

Three districts have been set aside and the members of the exchange will sell no property to negroes outside of these districts, as far as pos-

The districts are the ones in which the densest negro populations now are located. One district, now housing 5,000, is capable of holding 30, 000, realtors said. Another district in which between 50,000 and 55,000 negroes now live, has a capacity of

The negro population has increased from 65,000 in 1920 to 100,000, practically all of the increase coming from the south, authorities estimate.






