Several of Ranger's leading retail merchants who attended the Chamber of Commerce breakfast this morning were hurt by and are feeling resentful of a suggestion by City Finance Commissioner Frank Brown that prices are too high in Ranger.

Commissioner Brown is a nice dresser. He likes good clothes and has a finesse of touch that can detect a superior quality in some goods over others, but he does not always appreciate that nice tastes are likely to be expensive. Referring to a tie he wore at the breakfast he said he had paid \$1.25 for it in Ranger and that it could be bought in any other city for 75 cents.

One of the merchants said the tie referred to was a Chaney and the wholesale price paid was \$10.50 per dozen. Chaney ties retail the world over from \$1.00 to \$7.50 each, depending upon the quality of material used. He suggested that the commissioner should either cultivate less expensive tastes or compare prices in Ranger with prices in any other city for the same quality of goods, and not compare sitk prices here with cotton prices elsewhere.

As a matter of fact prices in Ranger are as low for nearly all goods as in Fort Worth, Dallas or any other Texas city, and lower for many articles. Prices in Ranger are lower than are charged in any other city or town in Eastland county, and the variety of selection will compare favorably with cities having 150,000 to 200,000 population. It is most astonishing to merchants in Eastland county cities outside of Ranger how the merchants here can afford to sell goods at the moderate prices they charge. The answer is, of course, advertising and turn-over, which the progressive merchants of Ranger have found most satisfactory in pleased customers and business headway. It is astonishing, if the truth

be known, how many Ranger people will go to Fort Worth or Dallas, or send away to some mail order house in the north and pay higher prices for "cheap" goods than they would pay for goods of fine quality here in Ranger. They may buy personally but without actual knowledge of the goods purchased, or they may buy sight unseen and be obliged to take either way, they have paid more for interfior goods than they would pay in Ranger for superior goods. It is not so with all, however. Some Ranger people are most loyal to the city and tis interests. One Ranger man is credited with having run out of gasoline in Fort Worth, and rather than buy in Fort Worth what he could buy in Ranger he returned to Ranger to buy his

The moral of the question is "Buy in Ranger and save money." It may be that the city of Ranger neglected to reduce its prices to the taxpayers when values declined, but that is no reason the finance commissioner should believe the merchants of Ranger are charging too high

Ranger merchants know they owe their splendid trade to low prices and fair and courteous treatment to all. They advertise their prices and these figures will compare with any published in Fort Worth or Dallas. In many instances they will be found lower, yet they handle superior merchandise. The moral, "Buy in Ranger."




