DESDEMONA IS VICTOR IN GAME WITH EASTLAND

Hard Hitting and Good Base Running Count for Gain; Score 6 to 3.

Nearly 500 enthusiastic fans witnessed the opening of a hard-fought game to Desdemona, 6 to 3. The Eastland team displayed flashy fielding but were out-hit by the visitors.

Features of the game were a double play unassisted by Fuller, Eastland and first sacker; the hitting of Royal of Desdemona, with a double and two singles in four times up; the hitting of Moore and Smith for Desdemona, the former fanning eight in four innings and the latter whiffing 10 in five frames, and the fielding of Cheatham, Eastland left fielder.

Eastland scored a run in the first inning on a hit and two errors. In the second, Eastland scored without making a hit. A base on balls, a muffed peg to second and a bad throw to third by the second sacker, turned the trick. After that, Desdemona's defense was errorless. Desdemona chalked up three in the fourth through a walk to Hale, Joiner's triple, Royal's double and Rails-

back's single. They added three more in the ninth, when Joiner doubled, Royal singled, a passed ball putting Royal on third and Smith's fly scoring him.

Eastland staged a rally in the ninth. Groves tripled to center and scored on Fuller's three-bagger that hit the right field fence. But the next three went out in order.

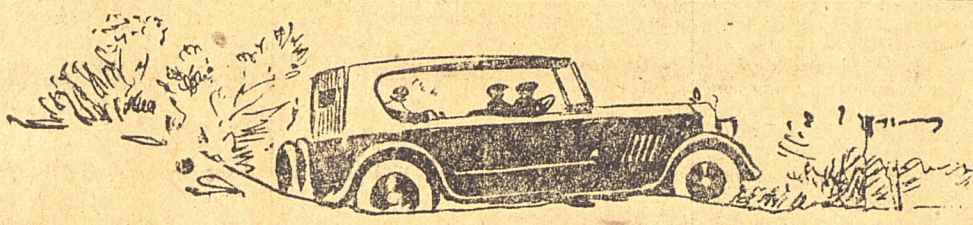
