AUSTIN, March 16. — The State Highway Commission awarded a con-tract to Coke and Turner, Marshall, Texas, road contractors to resurface highways in nine counties with bithulithic asphalt at the rate of 12 cents per square yard. This contract was held by the American Road company at a 30 cents rate prior to the revocation of the contract brought about through a suit filed by Attorney General Dan Moody last fall.

The old brone is like some folks I know—always follows the beaten trail. Results: I have some sore ribs from shimmying as he wigeles me over some sandy roads. If somebody would only take whatever it is out of the booze the fellows drink who first travel a sandy road after a rain, we might have a straight track once in a while. At that, I have a tooth or two left to munch fried chicken when the crop gets rine out on the Eastland and pleasant Grove road.


