Hughes told frankly why the United States had intervened in Central American responsibilities. He promised all nations, weak and strong requality in all matters. There was

equality in all matters. There was no apology in his pronouncement. He said the United States had sent troops to three Central American countries in the interests of neces sary peace and order and in each case desired only to stabilize condicions and get out as quickly as pos-

American republics. We have no policy of aggression. We do not wish their territory. The rights we assert for ourselves we accord to

NEW YORK .- New ideas in the nanagement of the United States diplomatic service and new opportunities for would-be American diplomats of the future were suggested by Myron T. Herrick, United States ambassador to France, in an interview with the United Press just before he sailed to resume his service in Paris.

Sought out by governors, leaders high in the councils of both political parties and by newspapermen, the ambassador chose to omit discussion of international affairs but to dwell instead on the council of the council nstead on improvements made in the American diplomatic service and encouragement of men who follow that service as a life career. His only set speech was made at the Union League club on the eve of his departure and in this, as well as in his in-

national importance. "College men of the future in American schools will come more and more to realize the appeal of the diplomatic service as a nie work," said the ambassador. "They will know that the United States government is encouraging them in their efforts to serve the country in diplomatic and consular posts. Even yet it is difficult for young men to maintain their positions in the service as they should due to the financial problem. But the United States government has made great strides forward in this matter and it is quite possible that in the future a man of even limited re-sources may go high in the work of our embassies and consulates."

Ambassador Herrick's remedy for the housing problem of the American embassy in Paris, a problem similar to those which other American ambassadors have met in many parts of the world due to lack of funds from the home government, caused him to receive considerable comment both at home and abroad. When francs were low he bought, and as a con-sequence the present American em-bassy in Paris, a structure valued at approximately \$1,000,000, cost the U. S. government less than one-third that sum. The ambassador with oth-er American diplomats, has long enservice which would put it on a par with those of the other great na-tion of the world, and along with these expenditures a decrease in the political importance of a diplomatic

"The importance of the foreign liplomatic service of the United states," said the ambassador, "of our liplomatic and consular service, hould be realized by every patriotic itizen. It is through our diplomatic representatives that we employ systematically and continuously, that is, in the only effective way, the re-

sources of peace.
"I am glad to say that in recent years there has been a new spirit in our foreign service. This is due to the fact that the service has been better organized and equipped.
