# PRECIOUS METALS IN MOUNTAINS IN BEXAR COUNTY AREA

DUBLIN, Aug. 11.—Arthur Griffin, the location of the buried mountains extending from northwest of San Antonio down through the eastern part of Bexar county and on to Corpus Christi which were recently named the Turle Mountains by the Southwest Texas Oil Men's association. L. V. J. Kimball, who spent many years in California and Colorado as a geologist in the gold and silver mines of those states, declares that the significance of these mountains should not be understood as being limited to oil alone but that in those mountains are great quantities of gold, silver, lead, zinc and other metals that rival the richest mines of California or Colorado. Furthermore, in the northern end of these buried mountains in San Saba county, Mr. Kimball Delieves will be found the "Lost Mine" of which are said to be written records, which the Spaniards hid at the time of an Indian raid and which have never

Mr. Kimball came to San Antonic some months ago after spending many years in California and Colorado as a geologist working for big mining concerns, and has had practical field experience of many years in locating and mining the precious metals as well as lead, sinc, and other basic metals. Within three blocks of the National Bank of Commerce in San Antonio he believes he has located a vein of ore a block or more wide and extending through one of the best business sections of the city, that is richer than many of the mines being worked in California. A few miles from San Antonio Mr. Kimball has located a vein however, which he believes will prove one of the richest veins that has even been found in any country. He believes tit is about 1.500 feet wide and has alrendy traced it out through the country for a distance of about 20 miles, the vein being especially rich in gold, but also hay ing considerable silver and other less valuable metals. He believes that by following this vein it will be found to lead to the "lost mine" of tradition in San Saba county which Spanish records de clare was remarkably rich and which adventureous persons are said to have since spent thousands of dollars in a fruitless spent thousands of dollars in a fruitless spent thousands of dollars in a fruitless

In fact, he claims thave already located some veins that are so rich as to surpass comprehension. At rangements are now being made to organize a company to sink a mine into on of these veins.

Mr. Kimball secured a number of specimens of ores picked up on a farm near San Antonio by the farmer who owns the place. These pieces of ore were gathered from the field as they were turned up by the plow and were saved merely because they were curious specimens and not through any knowledge that they contained valuable metals, and the owner was much surprised when told by Mr. Kimball of their real worth. The ore is known as drift ore, and is one of the evidences of the real vein.
