## RULE GOVERNING **ACTS OF RANGERS**

That he is having full co-opera-tion from the police department of Ranger and from the sheriffs department of Eastland county, and that all acts of the rangers are taken within the law, were statements made yesterday by Captain C. J. Blackwell, in charge of the state rangers in the Ranger district.

"I recently read a very interesting book by a well known author. which has been dramatized and thrown on the screen over the entire United States, the title of which is 'Within the Law.'" Captain Blackwell said. This work, after I had read it thoroughly, impressed me very much, and I am trying as an officer of many years' experience, with fairness to all, with no prejudice against anyone, to do my duty as an officer of the state, 'within the

No raids have been made without a search warrant, the captain said, and it will continue to be the policy of his force, while waging an unremitting war on evildoers, to stay strictly within the law in doing so, and not violate any rights of citizens.

In regard to holding of prisoners incommunicado, he asserted that that is being done under orders, and is a practice which is approved by the most modern legal procedure.

Captain Blackwell expressed gratification at the co-operation that has been shown him by local officers, and in turn pledged that of himself and his force. He said that the rangers were sent here to help enforce all laws, from traffic to murder, and that they would do their

best to fulfill this mission. "We like Ranger," the captain said in alluding to a street jest that they were sent here on a vacation. "We have thus far enjoyed our stay here very much and may decide to make it permanent."


