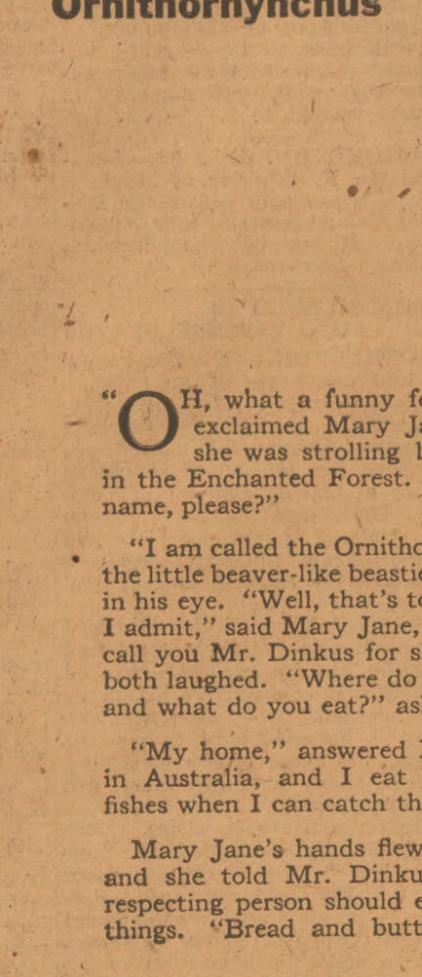
COUNTY COUNCIL BOARD TO MEET ON FRIDAY.

Police Will Sell Unredeemed Pledges

Several articles left by persons for guaranty of payment of fines assessed by the police department when they were placed under arrest for various offenses will be placed on sale and sold to the highest bidder, according to Chief of Police O. V. Davenport.

It has been the custom of the Ranger police department to permit persons whom they knew to leave articles of sufficient value to stand for their fines and hold the articles a certain period of time.

"I usually give them 60 days in which to pay off," said Chief of Police O. V. Davenport, "but lately they have been taking advantage of my good nature."

A 21-jewel Elgin watch, a .32-calibre automatic pistol and a .38-calibre automatic pistol will be placed on sale by the chief. The articles will not be auctioned off but persons desiring to place bids will be allowed to do so, the highest bidder to receive the article.

The watch and two automatics were placed as guaranty for payment of fines approximately 60 to 90 days ago and the chief said he was desirous of collecting his fines in order to close them out on the books.

Bids will be received on the articles today and will be disposed of in the next few days.
