

Increases of Oil Prices Quoted Today Reach Top of \$2.35 a Barrel.

A raise in the price of crude oil for this section was posted early this morning by the Prairie Oil & Gas company, which makes the third general raise this company has made within the past 20 days, the first advance being on Jan. 22 and the second on Jan. 30. An advance in the price of oil of 42 Baume gravity and above was made Feb. 7.

The increase made by the Prairie this morning, which is expected will be followed by other purchasing companies if they have not already done so, is for Kansas, Oklahoma and North Texas and is for all oil purhased by them at the wells.

In view of the conflicting reports that are sent out from Sand Cave by the news agencies represented there and by the special news writers, it is difficult to form any idea of the true conditions in the work of rescue to bring Col-lins from his cavern cell, and most any report may be believed until the next comes along and denies it.






