## Explosives Expert Tells Malaria Workers the Way To Blast Ditches



TOW to use dynamite in blast-H ing ditches and thus fight the malaria and mosquito plagues was described in detail to the recent conference of malaria field workers at New Orleans by W. B. Alford, one of the foremost experts in the South on the subject of blasting ditches. Mr. Alford, has personally blasted out many miles of ditches both for health control and for land reclamation and recently made a world's record at Patterson, Louisiana, by blast-ing 1200 feet of ditch, in one shot, through a right of way covered with stumps, logs, roots and de-bris, in the course of the antimalaria campaign being conducted at that place by national and state health officials. His work as an explosives expert of the du Pont Company has taken him into many of the districts in the South where health work is being successfully
