BOSTON.—Can you tell, at 100 per cent speed, whether docile and captious

If you can, you are probably all right mentally. That is, if you can answer these posers, and several pages more of other posers, hard as these or even harder. If you cannot answer with facility and dispatch then it's all verying for the

dispatch, then it's all wrong for you. For these are the questions which every student at Boston University School of Business administration is being asked. Under the direction of Dr. Edwin M. Chamberlain, head of the department of psychology the tests went on, and young business brows are wrinkling as the sheep are divided from the goats. Here follow some of the posers which students are answering.
