New Power Plant to Meet Need of City and Field

The new 10,000 horsepower generating station of the Oil Belt Power company, which will serve the needs for commercial power and lighting for Ranger, Eastland, DeLeon, Gorman and Breekenridge, as well as electrify the surrounding territory for oil well pumping and drilling, is expected to be put into operation by the first of July.

This plant will be the most up to date generating station in the southwest and it is estimated that the cost will be about \$1,500,000. It is located on the Leon river three miles out of Olden, seven miles from Ranger.

Pending the completion of this plant a transmission line is now completed between Eas and and Ranger, which will be tied into service April 1 to relieve the overloaded condition of the Ranger plant, whose load has increased faster than new machinery could be installed.

Ranger will be connected with the new plant by means of a 60,000 volt transmission line which will run into the company.
