



### BRICK CHURCH WILL BE BUILT AT MERRIMAN

The Merriman Baptist church, which became famous over the country during the oil boom by its determination to preserve the sacredness of its cemetery in the face of a \$1,000,000 offer for oil rights, is to have a new building. From \$10,000 to \$20,000 is to be spent in the construction of a brick edifice from funds derived from an oil well on the church property.

Bids for the new church have been advertised for by T. W. Duncan, one of the deacons, living at Eastland, and it is understood that the contract will be let as soon as possible. The present building or tabernacle is to be torn down or used for other purposes. Rev. J. C. Taylor of Cisco, is pastor of the church.

### DIAZ ANNOUNCES PLANS FOR MEXICAN REVOLT

NEW ORLEANS, June 2.—The revolution reported under way in Mexico will shortly be joined by General Felix Diaz, who will assume leadership of the forces seeking the overthrow of the Obregon government, according to an announcement today by Guillermo Rosas, secretary of General Diaz.

The revolution, which is already backed by approximately 15,000 trained troops and twenty military leaders of different states in Mexico, is fast gaining strength, the announcement stated. Leaders of the revolt seek to place Diaz at the head of the Mexican government and re-establish the constitution of 1857, the announcement says.

### MOTHER KILLED BY TRAIN IN ATTEMPT TO SAVE BABY SON

ST. LOUIS, June 2.—Mother love lost in a race of desperation with a speeding express train Thursday when Mrs. Bessie Adams, 26, dashed into the train's path in a vain effort to snatch her 18-month-old son, Elmer, from the tracks.

Both mother and child were killed. The Adams home is located 100 feet from the Frisco tracks at Tyson, in the suburbs.

### POLICE NAB SUSPECT AFTER LENGTHY CHASE

A young white man, found in possession of two automobile casings, a Jack and a pump, on the East Side, was captured by the police last night after a long chase and is being held at police headquarters on a charge of theft. Charges will be filed against him in the county, it is stated.

The man, who was found carrying the articles, is said to have stolen them from a garage in the Lackland addition. He is said to have immediately taken to his heels on encountering the officers. Chief Shell McDowell and Night Patrolmen Ingram and Daniels chased him for several blocks before he managed to elude the officers. Deputy Sheriff John Barnes then joined in the chase and the four officers later succeeded in locating and capturing their man.

### EVIDENCE HEARD IN VALENTINO BIGAMY CASE

LOS ANGELES, June 2.—Whether the preliminary hearing of Rudolf Valentino, film actor, on a bigamy charge will be resumed this afternoon depends on whether his attorneys are engaged in another case, as they announced they expected to be.

When the hearing adjourned yesterday after testimony in support of the state's charges, Justice Hanzy said it would be resumed today if the actor's attorneys were ready, and if not the case would be taken up again tomorrow morning.

The state has at least two more witnesses to testify that Valentino committed bigamy in Mexicali, Lower California, on May 13 by marrying Winnifred Hudnut, a movie art director.

In assuming the presidency of the club, Bizzell is given complete authority as president-manager and announces that he will strengthen the team so it will rise in the percentage column. The team is now in last place.

Bizzell announces that Sunday, June 4, the Abilene team will play Stamford on the local grounds. This will be the first Sunday game in Stamford since the organization of the league.

THORPE RELEASED

PORTLAND, Ore., June 2.—Jim Thorpe, star athlete and baseball player, is today a free agent in the baseball world as the result of his conditional release by the Portland club of the Pacific Coast league to bring that club within the twenty-player limit.

Thorpe has been handicapped by a

lame shoulder and inability to hit. He was the highest priced player in the coast league, his contract calling for approximately \$1,000 a month.

BILL GIVES STATES BIG SLICE OF OIL FUNDS

WASHINGTON, June 2.—The Mondell bill providing for 25 per cent of

the sum received in rents, royalties and bonuses on naval reserve oil lands to be paid to the state in which the reserves are located was reported on Thursday in the house.

The bill as drawn up provided for a payment of 37 1-2 per cent. Secretary Fall recommended that the amount be 20 per cent. The committee, however, compromised by stipulating 25 per cent.

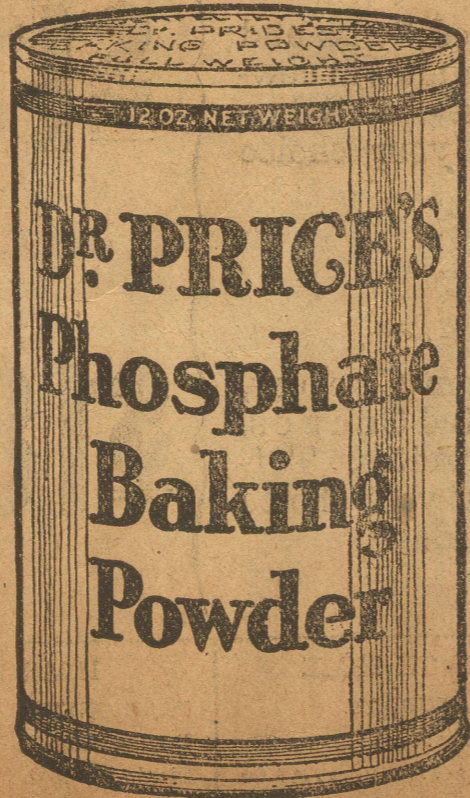
