## Increases Production

Pending the completion (about July) of our big 10,000 -horsepower Electric Generating Station on the Leon river between Eastland and Ranger, we are constructing a transmission line that will extend through the heart of the Eastland-Ranger oil field, including Pleasant Grove district. This line will connect the present generating stations in Eastland and ger together.

The completion of this transmission line about March 25 will give us an opportunity to take on a limited number of oil wells for pumping prior to the completion of our big plant on the Leon river.

The demands on the Eastland and Ranger plants for electric service for both commercial and power purposes make it necessary that the number of oil well pumping contracts for immediate service be limited.

We have made contracts for oil well drilling and pumping service, some of which will be taken on as soon as our line is completed.

After the completion of our big plant there will be no reasonable limit to the number of oil wells we can handle on the pump, in addition to the oil well drilling motors that will operate in this field.

Due to superiority of electric drive for the oil field over other methods and the fact that production managers are able to anticipate their requirements well in advance, we want to ask that you give the subject of electric drive for drilling and pumping serious consideration, not overlooking the fact that we will have unlimited capacity after July this year.

The first cost for electric drive equipment for oil well pumping and drilling is much less than steam or gas engine, and much more dependable from an operating standpoint, since no water is required, uncertainty of fuel supply is eliminated, fire hazards reduced to minimum, low cost of maintenance and repairs, in addition to being able to get the neces-
