THE "THIRD DEGREE."

Torture in the form of screw and rack has been outlawed throughout the civilized western world for nearly 2000 years, although it was not stricken from the French law until 1789.

Among the other tortures by legal authorities under Philip II of Spain, in whose reign the inquisition reached its most ignoble heights, was the keeping of the victims without sleep. Today in our own country "the third degree" is condemned by jurists, prosecutors and many policemen and former police officials. In spite of this almost wholesale condemnation and the fact that in many courts confessions and statements made exclusively by prisoners to prosecutors and police are not accepted in evidence, the practice of forcing prisoners to speak against their will continues.

A Chinese student in Washington was recently tortured into a confession of murder which the supreme court set aside and ordered a new trial. It is to be hoped that courts, make an honest effort to abolish this brutal system.

Newspaper police court reporters are quite familiar with the methods in most American cities among certain types of police officers and detectives, who too often use this opportunity for wreaking personal vengeance or "putting the fear of God" in the heart of their unfortunate prisoner.

The lad from the country, unaccustomed to the bright lights of the city, has long been familiarly known as a "rube," or a "jay." Today the term is applied to the man, woman or child who attempts to cross the street from diagonal corners, or at the middle of a block in congested or business areas. Whether he hails from the country or the city he is now considered not only a nuisance but cause of loss and damage to traffic, and many municipalities are considering ordinances providing for his arrest for violating traffic rules.

That business concerns must serve in order to succeed. They must do everything in their power to advance the interests of the business of the home city.

That they must show the right spirit. Boost the home city, not once in a while but all the while.

That many cities are judged by the service given by its stores. In some of them you will find surly clerks, often-times conceited ones, and once in a while a snappy one; that class usually makes business for some stores—but others than the ones they are working in, and occasionally they make business for some other city or even for mail order houses.

That to reap the harvest of service and a quicker turnover of stock, means that a business will have to sow the seeds of effort.

That it can best be done by quality and advertising, backed up by obliging clerks, the ones who believe in giving the customers service, the clerks who can smile and make the customers feel that they are favoring the store with their business.

Some grouchy clerks act as though they were doing the customers a great favor when they condescend to let them buy. The buying public can get along by staying away from those stores, but those stores cannot get along without the buying public.

SCIENTIST EXPLAINS HOW LIGHTNING IS CAUSED

The latest accepted theory about the cause of lightning is based on experiments conducted in India by Dr. George C. Simpson. Simpson's explanation starts with the fact, previously determined by laboratory experiments, that when drops of water are broken up there is a separation of negative and positive electricity.

This process occurs on a large scale in thunderstorms, where the falling raindrops are broken before they reach the earth by the powerful uprushes of air that occur in such storms. Positive electricity tends to remain in the drops, while negative electricity is carried aloft by the rising air and eventually gives a strong negative charge to the higher parts of the clouds.

The two kinds of electricity have a tendency to recombine and neutralize each other, but they are kept from doing so by the air, which is a bad conductor. However, when the opposite charges are strong enough they suddenly break a path through the air and lightning is produced.—Mentor Magazine for October.

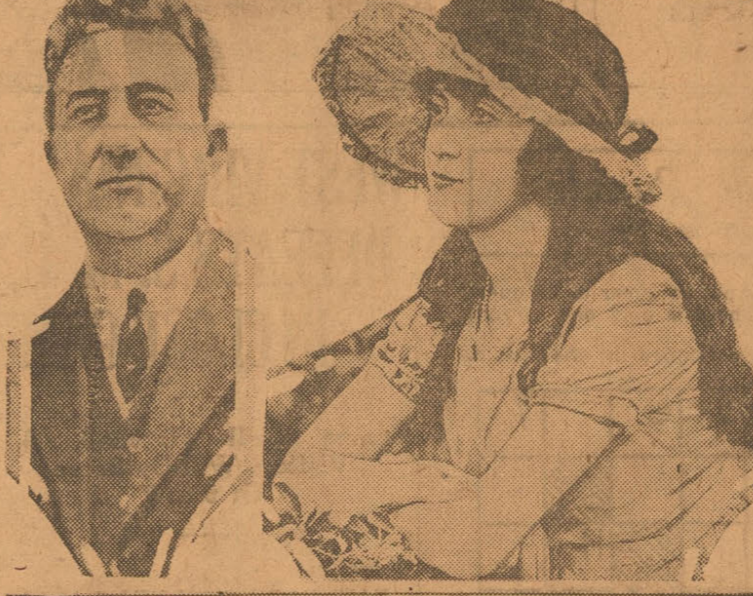
WHEN HE SLIPPED

MANGLED BY INFERNAL MACHINE

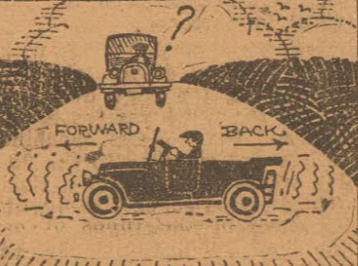


RUINS OF TORCHIA HOME, (Below) ERNEST TORCHIA & EMILY TORCHIA.

DIRECT LAWS AT RECKLESS DRIVING

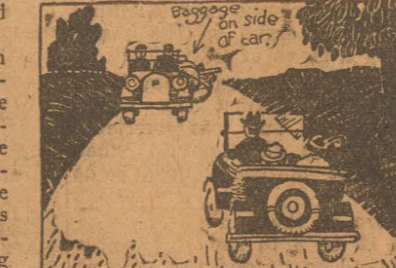


Reckless driving, but not ordinarily considered as such.

ONLY a very small percentage of the street and highway accidents today can be attributed directly to construction and engineering defects," declares the Committee on Engineering and Construction of the National Conference on Street and Highway Safety in a report submitted to Secretary Hoover.

The committee emphasizes the need of providing right-of-way for parking spaces, for clear view at intersections, and for the future widening "before the cost of land becomes prohibitive."

"Grade crossing elimination through cooperation of municipalities, states and railroads must be the ultimate remedy for the railroad-highway grade-crossing peril," the Committee declares, with the continuing recommendations that "the creation of new grade crossings should be avoided wherever possible" even to the extent of relocating highways to avoid such difficulties.

Buttercups

2 cups of molasses
1/2 cup of water
2 cups of Diamond Star Sugar
1 level teaspoon of cream of tartar
Finely chopped nuts, raisins, figs or dates, or a mixture of part or all.

Cook the molasses, sugar, water and cream of tartar together until a little dropped into cold water forms a soft ball between the fingers. Turn out onto a buttered platter, and when cool enough to handle, pull into white and light. Spread a layer or sheet of this on the platter or slab, and over it place a layer of the fruit or nut mixture. Cover with more of the plain candy and then cut the strips into individual portions, using buttered or oiled scissors for the operation.

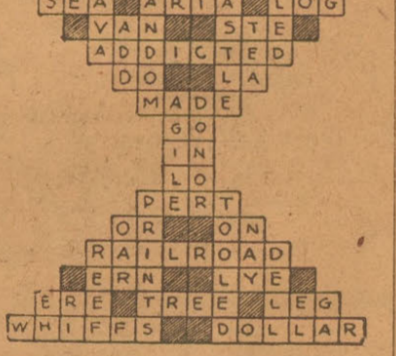

HOW "LEAD KINDLY LIGHT" CAME TO BE WRITTEN

In 1833 a young Englishman, ill and weary for home, took passage on an orange boat from Sicily to France. In the Bay of Bonifacio the wind died, and for a full week there was unending fog, the danger of an un-felt tide and current, the mystery of a leaden sea. From the haze, where all things seemed at a halt, came the inspiration of the hymn "Lead, Kindly Light," to the young passenger.

It was out of loneliness and heartsickness that the lines of the immortal hymn took form. The young Englishman was John Henry Newman, then a University man of 32; later he became a cardinal.

The music for Newman's words came years later. In 1865 Dr. John B. Dykes, a man of note as an organist and composer, was walking one day in the Strand, the busiest of London thoroughfares. And there, amid the hubbub of the city, the melody grew in his mind so that when he returned to his study he set down the notes of "Lead, Kindly Light."—The Mentor Magazine.
