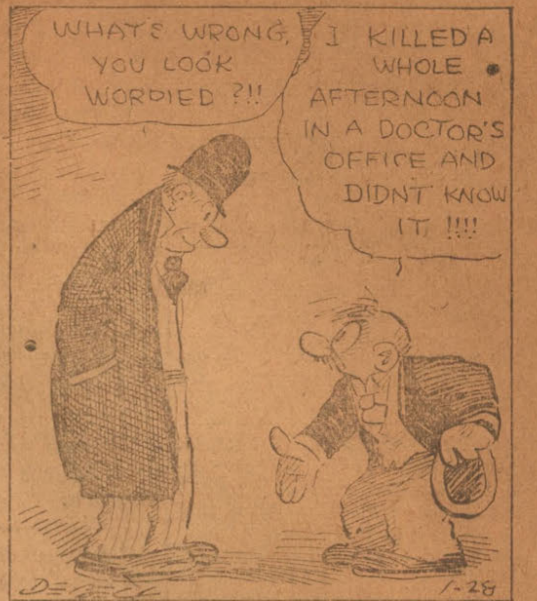
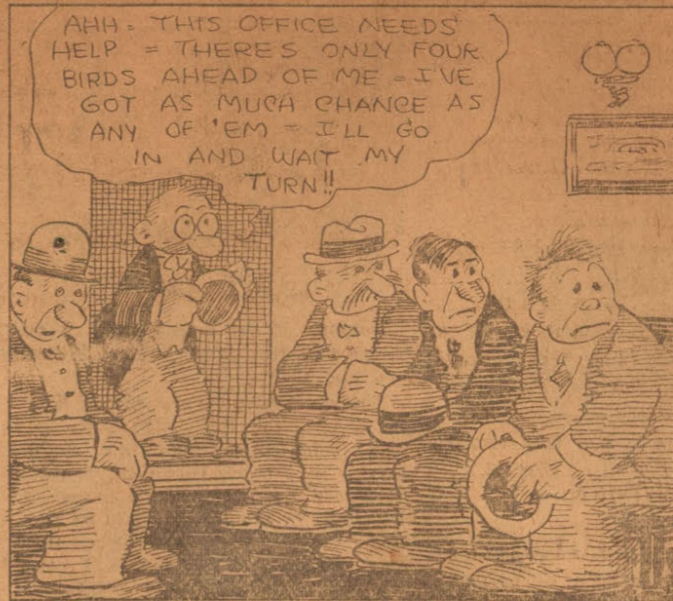

DETECTIVE RUST GIVES SECOND 'POSSUM SUPPER' TO RANGER POLICEMEN

The second 'possum supper of the winter to be given the members of the police department was held last night at a local cafe. On this occasion Detective Dick Rust was host. With the exception of Assistant Chief Reynolds and Desk Sergeant Singleton, all members of the force were present. Several out of town peace officers were among the guests. Several other such suppers are planned among the members of the department during the remainder of the winter.

FIVE CARS OF PAVING BRICK HERE; MORE ON WAY

Five cars of paving brick were received by the McKenzie Construction company and eleven cars are now in transit, according to W. L. Gibson, superintendent of the Ranger work. Mr. Gibson said that he is maintaining a man at Thurbur permanently to see that Ranger receives its proper share of brick. Under this arrangement he hopes to receive enough material to complete the entire paving program some time in the spring. At this time all curbs, gutters and concrete base has been constructed and many blocks are waiting the laying of the brick. A part of the sixteen cars that will be placed shortly will be used to finish East Main street, and on that part of South Oak street that has the base laid. This is only about two blocks and it is hoped that South Oak will be opened to traffic shortly. WOMAN WOODED TWENTY YEARS SUES FIANCE FOR 'WASTED TIME'

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 28.—Miss Laura Heller of Quakertown was allowed \$5 for each of the twenty years that Erwin Hillegas had "wasted her time" by a jury in the Bucks county court at Doylestown this afternoon. The Quakertown cigar worker had brought suit for \$10,000 against Hillegas, well to do cigar salesman of the same town, charging breach of promise to marry.

The jury reached its verdict after deliberating for three hours and twenty minutes. One woman, Miss Winifred Callahan of Bristol, served with the eleven male jurors. Miss Heller was not in court, nor was Hillegas' young wife, whom he married after jilting the plaintiff. Hillegas was there, however. He did not seem especially elated at the verdict, which also assessed costs of the action against him.

In her suit Miss Heller alleged that Hillegas had called upon her constantly for twenty years and had kept other men away. Judge Ryan, in summing up, reminded the jury that Miss Heller had testified Hillegas had proposed to her May 9, 1919, but that Hillegas had denied this, and testified that when he asked her to marry him she replied she would some time, but not then. "If the defendant is to be believed in this statement," said the judge, "this is not an acceptance that would make the contract binding."

Counsel for Miss Heller said it was unlikely that she would appeal, as it was not money she wished, but vindication.

AUTO CRASH ON MAIN ST. SHATTERS WINDSHIELDS
