INSURANCE AGAINST TYPHOID.

At a meeting of city officials and Chamber of Commerce representatives i vas determined that strict attention mus be given the matter of waste disposal i the city is to be spared a serious cpi demic of typhoid fever. The chief men nee discussed was the outhouse, of which there are a great many in Ranger Places that present to the fly his favor-ite breeding place and which serve as fortile hunting grounds for the typhoid

The city has a sewage disposal system that takes care of this matter in a meas-ure. There are sanitary wagons that go about collecting refuse to be disposed of n a properly appointed place, but it has leveloped that this method is not gener ully patronized. In other words, there are residents here who wilfully maintain pon their property avoidable nuisance

upon their property avoidable nuisances and menacies. In the meeting referred to it was re-solved to obtain the enactment of laws here compelling all residents to make uses the sanitary provision, that all waste mat-ter be disposed of according to a plan pht into operation by the city's health ex-perts. It was pointed out that the ty phoid fever season is here and unless something is done immediately, there is liable to be a serious condition. The city was urged to order all de-

The city was urged to order all de osits of refuse matter of whatecer char-cter in which flies breed, covered with ime. It will require a great quantity of lime and the operative who supervises the treatment must be a thoroughgoing official. There are hundreds of deposits that should be covered and to make the measure effectual, not one should be

missed. A strong spirit of co-operation has been manifested in a clean-up of the entire city, since the Chamber of Commerce leunched its campaign. The new police judge has announced he will take an ac tive part in the clean-up drive, further ing the work of others where possible. 




