# TERRIFIC WIND STORM RAGES IN INDIANA

## LIVE WIRES ARE MENACE IN INDIANAPOLIS

Storm Tangles and Levels Them; Property Damage Above Million Dollars

CHICAGO, July 13.—The middle west today counted the dead at 26 and estimated the property damage at more than one million dollars in the wake of the wind and electrical storms and severe heat waves. The heaviest property loss was in Central Indiana, where a terrific wind and rain storm whipped roofs from houses, uprooted trees, leveled telegraph and telephone poles and flooded cellars.

Five persons were drowned in Iowa. Four persons succumbed to the heat in St. Paul and Minneapolis, where the mercury climbed to 92. Two persons were drowned and two deaths from heat prostration occurred in Chicago. Two deaths from heat prostrations were reported in Nebraska and two were drowned in St. Louis.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., July 13.—A large portion of Indiana was visited late yesterday by a terrific wind storm, accompanied by heavy rains, which uprooted trees, tore off roofs and tore down telephone and telegraph poles, doing upwards of a million dollars damage. Indianapolis and the countryside for miles around was digging and hauling out from the wreckage today.

Indianapolis was in darkness last night, during which thousands of feet of live wires were torn down and twisted about in the streets, making travel dangerous. Lightning caused 32 fires in the city within 24 minutes while the storm was at its height. Communication with other points on every side was interrupted. Along the northern border of Indiana and extending between Peru, Ind., and Peoria, Ill., roads have been washed out, cables broken and crops damaged. The gale blew at a rate of 80 miles an hour.

## COLORADO HAS SERIES OF WEEK-END TRAGEDIES

CHICAGO, July 13.—Three deaths and about 25 injured in week-end accidents in Colorado were reported in messages received here. Two negroes were killed when a sight-seeking truck plunged over a precipice in Boulder canyon. Four persons were injured in a motor car crash near Jefferson and three of them may die. In other casualties a number of persons were injured severely.

One man was drowned in Washington lake park here, when he got beyond his depth. His companion, a woman, was revived after she had been given up as dead.

## Gainesville Man Is Killed in Car Crash Near Gordon

Death resulting from injuries when his car overturned on the highway near Gordon about 6 o'clock Sunday morning, stopped the homeward journey of Eugene R. Leonard of Gainesville, 40, son of J. T. Leonard, editor and publisher of the Gainesville Register. The top of the car fell on him, crushing his head at the temple.

An ambulance of Killingsworth-Cox company of Ranger, summoned by officers in Gordon, reached there too late, Leonard dying shortly before the ambulance arrived. Mr. Killingsworth made the run in fast time, arriving at Gordon a little after 9 o'clock. The body was taken to the undertaking parlor at Gordon, prepared for burial and then sent to Gainesville for interment.

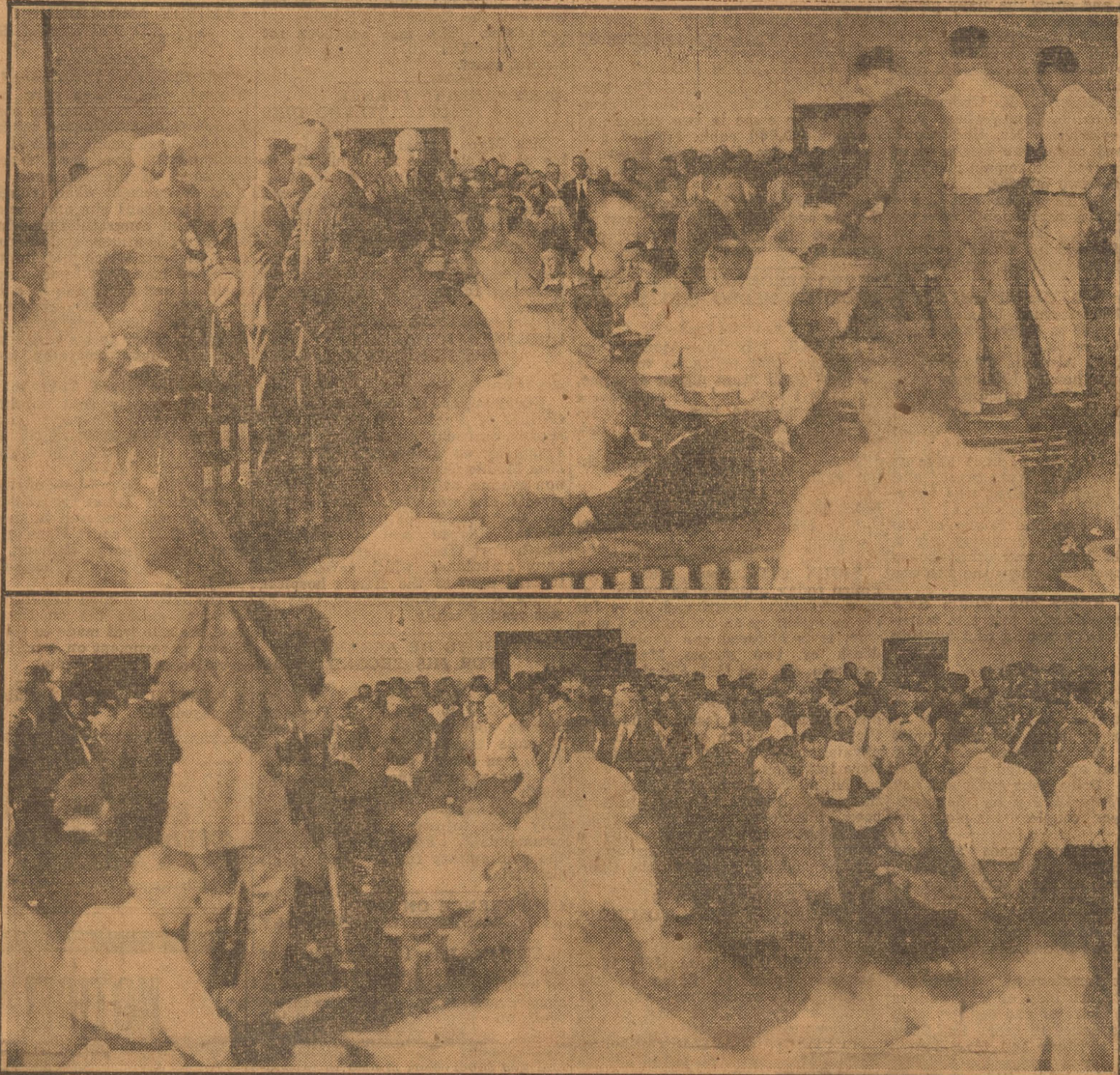
According to a report given to Killingsworth, Leonard was accompanied by a young fellow, who was riding with him to Fort Worth. Returning from West Texas, they had been driving all night and Leonard is thought to have gone to sleep at the wheel and swerved the car suddenly in the road as it had turned completely over in the middle of the highway. When the car turned over, Leonard was hurled clear of it but the top of the car came down on his head and crushed it.

## NEW YORK SUBWAYS FLOODED WHEN WATER MAIN BREAKS

NEW YORK, July 13.—A broken water main which flooded three subways today caused city engineers to take extra precautions to safeguard property that might be undermined by the swirling waters. Several streets have been roped off and through traffic barred pending investigation to determine the damage done. Meanwhile hundreds of workers, using engines, were pumping out six to eight feet of water that flooded subways under the Grand Central terminal.

## Police Recover Goods Alleged to Have Been Stolen; Make Arrest

Ranger police last night recovered a quantity of shirts, alleged to have been stolen from Campbell and Fagg of Eastland, and several Ford casings said to belong to owners of cars residing at the DeGroff hotel and who leave their cars outside at night. A man who gave his name as Raymond Price of Ranger, is held for investigation by the police.

According to the police the articles were recovered at the home of people, who implicated the man who gave his name as Price, saying that Price left the shirts and tires at their home. The shirts were identified by Mr. Fagg, of Campbell and Fagg of Eastland, and the police say that two of the casings have been identified.

The man under arrest made no statement whatever to the police, despite several attempts at questioning, but called for a lawyer.

## WILL ROGERS IS WILLING TO BE GOVERNOR

Must Have Election Guaranteed, He Insists, However, And Awaits Offers.

OKLAHOMA CITY, July 13.—Will Rogers, former Oklahoman and nationally known comedian and writer, said today in a telegram to the Oklahoma City News that he must have the election as governor of Oklahoma guaranteed before he gives up his present job.

Former Congressman James Davenport launched a boom several days ago for Rogers for governor of Oklahoma, and when the Oklahoma City News wired him for an opinion on his proposed candidacy he replied:

"Are you people in Oklahoma getting jealous of the State of Tennessee? Even with me as governor we can't compete with them in humor, but if you are serious and want me to be your governor, I will come home. However, I must have the election as governor guaranteed before I give up my present job. Wire your best offer at once. Yours for honesty in politics."

## MAN HUNT FOR 'INTELLECTUAL' BEING PUSHED

Alleged Super-Thrill Slayer Believed to Have Turned Hijacker Near Utica.

PLATTSBURG, N. Y., July 13.—Winging over the St. Lawrence valley, a swift army of airplanes today joined the upstate manhunt for Philip Knox Knapp, college graduate and army deserter, wanted in connection with the death of Louis Panella, whom he is believed to have killed in a cold-blooded search for super-thrills.

Lieut. Marion Elliott and Lieut. Walter H. Sargent flew near from Mitchell field to participate in the pursuit. Knapp is thought likely to be making for Canada or Alexandria bay, where once he joined a bootlegging band, always seeking for a new sensation.

A lone highwayman who held up and robbed two automobile drivers on a highway near Utica Sunday answers "some what the description of Knapp. Panella, who was killed, was a taxicab driver living at Hempstead, N. Y.

## Three Men Plead Guilty to Charge of Gaming in Ranger

Pleading guilty to a charge of gaming, three men, residents of Ranger, caught playing cards in the business establishment of W. H. Dyer, 405 W. Main street, Sunday afternoon about 6 o'clock, each paid a fine of \$20.70 into the city treasury.

S. B. Alderson, John Butler, and Truman Davis, were caught in the raid, being engaged at the time of the raid in playing, it was charged, with cards. W. H. Dyer, owner of the establishment, was not present at the time of the raid. The doors leading inside the place were all securely locked, but were opened after the police knocked on them. No charges were filed against Dyer, the police said.

The three men were arraigned before City Judge A. A. Diehl and pleaded guilty to the charge of gaming, each paying the fine of \$20.70 assessed against him and being then released.

## TEXAS PIPE LINE MEETS HIGHER PRICES FOR OIL

The Texas Pipe Line company has met the recent rise in prices of crude oil, increased by the Prairie Gas and Oil company, last Friday. The new prices became effective at 7 a. m., July 10, according to officials of the Texas company who were notified of the change in price today.

## Lawyers Forget to Discuss Evolution To Argue About Own Mental Attainments

DAYTON, Tenn., July 13.—A quaint old Tennessee lawyer, with his glasses on the end of his nose, touched off some verbal fireworks at the resumption of the Scopes trial today.

Dudley Field Malone, of New York, one of the defense attorneys, leaped to his feet in angry protest when General Ben McKenzie, a local lawyer, who is assisting the prosecution referred to the apparent inability of "these here New York lawyers" to understand the anti-evolution law in Tennessee, "which is so simple a 16-year-old Rhea county school boy gets it."

Malone indignantly demanded defense against "contemptuous references" to himself and his colleagues and Judge John T. Ralston smoothed things over by apologizing, saying that the "foreign" counsel didn't understand General McKenzie as well as homefolks did.

The argument came as during an argument on a motion by the defense to dismiss the indictment against John T. Scopes. Attorneys Neal and Hays spoke for the defense. The latter stirred up a hornet's nest by introducing an indictment couched in the terms of that drawn against Scopes citing a law which forbade any one under penalty of death from teaching any theory except that which held the earth was the center of the universe and that the sun moved around it from east to west.

"No such law ever passed through the brain of a Tennesseean. I don't know about the place Hays came from," General McKenzie said. Further references by the general to New York lawyers roused Malone's ire.

## Several Tramps Die In Wreck of Train

TAYLOR, Texas, July 13.—Rescue crews dug frantically today in the charred and twisted debris of a Katy freight train wrecked near here for traces of six men believed to have died in the wreckage. Three bodies were pulled from the holocaust of 20 blazing oil and gasoline tank cars, Sunday afternoon.

All of the victims were beating their way, according to a checkup by trainmen. Nine tramps were known to be on the wrecked section of the train when it left Taylor, trainmen said.

## Evacuation of Ruhr By French is Begun

LONDON, July 13.—Evacuation of the Ruhr by French troops was begun today, according to Central News dispatches from Berlin. Virtually all troops are reported to have left Gelsenkirchen, one of the important centers of the great coal and iron region.

## PARDON BOARD RETURNS FROM PENITENTIARY VISIT

AUSTIN, July 13.—Members of the state pardon board returned Monday from inspection of Huntsville prison, and several prison farms. Only a few pardons will be recommended, mostly to tuberculars and the helpless, it was said.

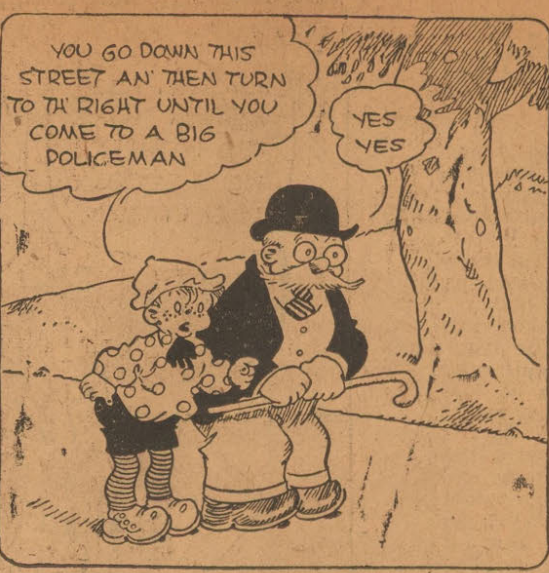
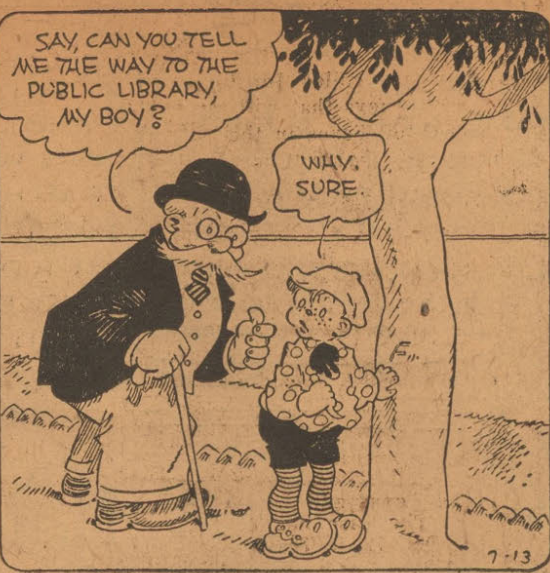
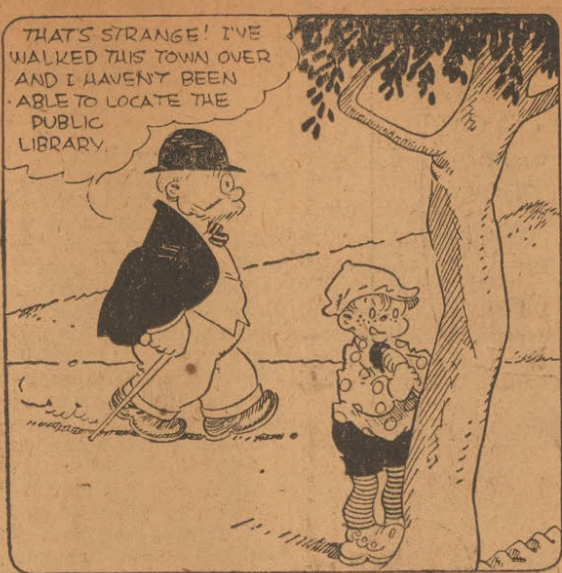

### Dieting Suggestions to Overcome Nervous Strain or Nervous Breakdown

Mary Jane Parker of the home economics department of the Calumet Baking Powder Co., gives the following suggestions for the diet of a nervous person:

"Overwork," "nervous breakdown," etc., in most cases are just masks behind which dwell sins against the simple laws of nutrition and hygiene. The real cause of the wreck or nervous breakdown which follows severe strain is in most cases poisons due to constipation and intestinal putrefaction which steadily undermines the resistance of the body.

Lack of exercise, fresh air, rest, improper diet, and intestinal disturbances are usually at the bottom of nervous disorders, and to correct the former is to overcome and cure the latter. There is no disease that requires so little medicine as nerve exhaustion.

Persistence in following the right diet and the right model of living in each detail as to foods, exercises, fresh air, and sleep may require the patience of Job and a lot of determination not to backslide. But, that is much better than a worn-out nervous condition that will make you old before your time.

**High Priced Advice**  
I know a girl in her twenties who

had not only grown extremely nervous but was troubled with insomnia (which as we know frequently goes with a nervous condition). She had gone to a doctor expecting him to prescribe some very wonderful medicine and perform a miracle perhaps, for his fee was quite a large one.

She was almost amazed, however, when he gave her no medicine at all, but laid down some very simple rules of exercise and diet which he told her were the only things that would cure her.

She remarked afterward that the rules he gave her were so simple and common-sense like, that anyone might have told her as much—but that she had paid such a price for the advice, she felt she ought to at least give them a trial. Fortunately she possessed a firm determination to overcome the trouble and really did follow the advice.

Diet alone, however, cannot correct nervousness, as I will just mention some of the points that must be followed as well as a correct diet to correct this trouble.

**Relaxation Necessary.**  
During the day, arrange to have several short periods of perfect relaxation. Just stop and let everything go. Relax completely in body

### Sun and Air and Wholesome Food Give Health and Energy to Growing Children

(By Barbara Brooks, Kellogg Company, Home Economics Department, Battle Creek, Mich.)

No longer do housewives pull down the shades to keep out the sunlight so that the carpet will not be faded! Sun porches are common. Here the children can play during the winter and have the sun beam warmly upon them. The sun, with its rays strong enough to make colors fade, uses its rays to aid in keeping people well. Especially in the summer has the sun curative power—and we should let it shine on the bodies of our children unobstructed by window glass or garments.

Wherever you live—in the city or country—make the most of the summer sunshine. Let the children play in it and dress them as scantily as possible. In town, much fun can be had by putting bathing suits on the children and letting them play under the sprinkler. In the country, there is usually a brook or pond nearby and lots of free air and sunshine.

In addition to these two great natural gifts, sun and air, children need wholesome food. One quart of milk a day provides bone and building material and vitamins. Fruit and

two vegetables besides potatoes, furnish minerals and vitamins. An egg will give building material and iron. Whole cereals, bran muffins and bread keep the body regulated.

Meals for a Summer Day Breakfast—Sliced pineapple with stewed prunes, corn flakes, milk, soft cooked egg, toast, milk.

Dinner—Scalloped potatoes and bacon, new peas, bran muffins, caramel custard.

Supper—Cream of spinach soup, vegetable relatin salad, graham bread, oatmeal cookies, milk.

Arrange too, for plenty of time for meals. No matter what you have on hand, that you imagine has to be done, eat your meals slowly and rest for at least a half an hour after eating.

I believe we seldom, if ever find this trouble—nervousness—in a person who does outdoor work and who has plenty of exercise, for outdoor life and fresh air are a sauce to the appetite and a tonic to digestion.

It would, therefore, seem that we should consider the diet of a person following a sedentary occupation.

It is really not the question as to what foods are good for and what are bad for a nervous person. It is simply a question of the foods that will produce the maximum of health in the person and nature will, in her way, overcome the nervous troubles.

The first thing to be done is to adopt a dietary and a system of living to rebuild the nerve cells. This dietary should be simple and nutritious, abounding in lettuce, spinach, celery, and intact all green edibles—meat in moderation—fruits used freely—few or no rich foods—no condiments or stimulants. Not overcrowding the stomach, but feeding it instead of just filling it.

Chewing the foods very thoroughly to appease the appetite without excess, drinking plenty of water to make easier the elimination of waste and to keep the body in good condition—and no stimulants which overwork the nerves, leaving them tired and worn out—all these points are well to remember.

### Menus for the Family

- Breakfast—Stewed prunes, cereal, thin cream, bread crumb omelet, toast, milk, coffee.
- Luncheon—Baked hash, bran bread, currant jelly, drop cookies, milk, tea.
- Dinner—Vegetable soup, toast sticks, egg salad, whole wheat bread, caramel custard with fruit sauce, sponge cake, milk, coffee.
- This day's menu is planned for a day when the entire family is at home for the noon meal. The evening meal is light, easily prepared but nourishing.
- Left-over meat can be used in the baked hash if convenient.
- BAKED HASH**  
One-half pound round steak ground, 1 cup chopped carrots, 1 cup chopped potatoes, 2 medium-sized onions, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-4 teaspoon pepper, 1-2 cup dried bread crumbs, 4 tablespoons buttered crumbs.
- Mix meat and dried bread crumbs thoroughly. The vegetables should be put through the food chopper. Combine vegetables and meat mixture. Season with salt and pepper and put into a well-buttered baking dish. Pour over milk and cover with buttered crumbs. Cover dish and bake in a slow oven for one hour. Remove cover to crisp and brown the crumbs. Serve in the baking dish.
