A guide book designed for the prospective small home owner has been issued by the United States government, the department of commerce announcing the publication of a handbook setting forth details which assert the steps necessary to acquiring such property.

This aid to home builders is a publication entitled, "How to Own Your Home." It carries a foreword by Herbert Hoover, secretary of commerce, and was compiled by John M. Gries and James S. It is the 'square deal'-and it is not only right but essential that the cards should not be stacked against the home seeker.'

"Maintaining a high percentage of individual home owners is one of the searching tests that now challenge the people of the United States," Secretary Hoover asserted in urging "the own-your-home" idea. "The present large proportion of families that own their home is both the foundation of a sound economic and social system and a guarantee cessful. that our society will continue to develop rationally as changing conditions demand.'

## U. S. SUPREME IN TENNIS PLAY

NEW YORK, Sept. 18 .- In no other internatioal suport, with the possible exception of the Olympic games, has the United States established the prestige and superiority that it has in tennis.

American golfers have had only ordinary success in international play and as a golf nation the United States is much younger than it is on the court.

Polo, another of the more polite sports, has brought mixed success to American teams and, although the international cup is held at present in this country, the supremacy of this country is not so pronounced, as England had to start all over after the ravages of the war.

The United States has yet to be defeated in the Olympic games, mostly because this country has such a big start and has such an immense field to draw from. With the development of track and field sports in the smaller European nations, the prestige of the United States is threatened and will be actually endangered at the Paris games next

European nations still hold almost complete sway in fencing, and American oarsmen have not been consistently successful in the big international regatta.

Professional boxing, in which the United States is almost supreme, is not considered because the game as it is promoted and managed in the United States offers little to boast about in clean sportsmanship.

During the regime of the late Wilding, Brookes and Patterson, Australia was about as safe in the possession of the cup as the Unite States is now with Tilden and John ston, holding places as the two bes players in the world.






