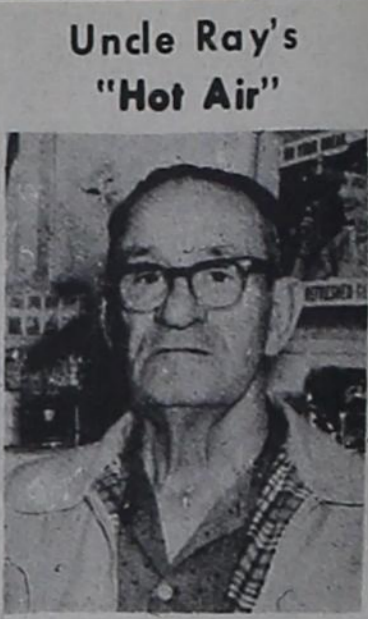

**Texico Wolverines Sweep Past Roy**

 The Texico Wolverines might be compared to a jar of milk this year. That sounds odd but it is fitting. Just as it takes awhile for the cream in a jar of milk to rise to the top, so it also took the Texico team awhile to show themselves. The Wolverines were plagued with many problems this year including injuries to key players and also a largely inexperienced team. It took a few hard games and a lot of hard practice but the Wolverines put it to use Friday night in their stunning 56-8 victory over the Roy Longhorns. The game was Texico's last game of the season and also served as homecoming.

For a short time it was a close game with the Wolverines ahead 13-8. The two Wolverine scores came on the fine running of Albert Steward and Ricky Ketcherside. Curtis Lindley kicked the extra point after touchdown. Lindley displayed fine kicking form throughout the game, booting four extra points through the uprights. Lindley also kicked some very fine kickoffs. From there on out, though, the Wolverines just couldn't be beat. A fine defensive line making several unassisted tackles and contributing to several others, Albert Steward shone on defense by both stopping the runners and also covering the air very well. Ricky Ketcherside played perhaps his best game of the season picking up very fine yardage on the ground and playing a hard defensive game.

Several seniors played their last game for Texico last Friday night including Albert Steward whose name has stood for dependability for three years as a running back for the Wolverines. Steward was named to the All-State squad last year and is a candidate again this year. Ricky Ketcherside deserves recognition for his fine play as a defensive player. Doug Harrison also played his final game Friday night. Harrison came by the name of "Hands" during his playing days because of his sureness with a pass. Randy Skaggs has been an anchor in the Wolverine offensive line for the past two years. Skaggs also was named to the All-State squad last year. Loren Gibbs is respected by his teammates as a fine football player. Gibbs has not received a lot of publicity but he has been a decisive factor in the way the team performed. He also played his last game for the Green and White.

"We finally did everything right," commented Head Coach Jim Wynne. "Everybody did their job. No one person gave any more effort than any other person. We had an outstanding (Continued on Page 4)

Farwell Loses Close Game To Kangaroos

Kress Kangaroos, with two quick scores in the third quarter, overcame an early Steer advantage and went on to win the see-saw battle 12-6.

The game, held in Kress Friday night, developed into a defensive duel with both teams having trouble maintaining a steady offensive drive on the rainsoaked field. Neither team could hold on to the ball and between them accumulated a total of nine fumbles and four interceptions.

Kirk McFarland fielded the opening kickoff and scampered to the 27 before he was downed by an intercepting Kangaroo. Then the Steer offense, commanded by Brett Hargrove, took over the ball. After three running plays having only netted a total of seven yards, Farwell established the pattern for the rest of the night and wisely elected to punt. Kevin Hardage booted the ball to the Kress 38, and the Kangaroos took possession.

On the first play from scrimmage, Roy Jackson "hopped" through the Farwell defensive secondary and gained a first down on the Kress 48. This was Kress' last first down of the quarter, however, and after a barrage of offsetting penalties Kress was forced to punt.

Farwell Junior High and Farwell High School Junior Varsity teams will travel to Sudan today (Thursday). Farwell seventh grade game will begin at 5 p.m. with the other games following.

Farwell eighth grade slipped past Kress last Thursday with a 30-28 win which came in the last minute of the game. Head Coach Larry McDorman credited Jack Foster with three TDs, Gerald Hardage with catching a 20-yard pass for a TD and Javier Galvan with one TD.

Mike Goettsch ran over the extra points to give their team the win. LeFevre said Robin Vidaurre, Joe Kirk and Joe Haseloff did some outstanding blocking on the line. Mike Goettsche was also credited by LeFevre as doing a great job in calling the plays. Also mentioned by the coach was an outstanding job by his defense.

After a Kangaroo interception and a subsequent fumble, Farwell took possession on the Kress 45 and quickly moved the ball to the 25 where they faced a fourth and one situation. But once again the squealing pigskin seemed to become animated and kicked into the hands of Kangaroo Kim Norris, numbing yet another Farwell scoring threat.

Quarterback Harley Terell, giving alternately to Weaver McClure and Mike Motheral, maneuvered the Kangaroos to their own 33 before a 15-yard penalty apparently stymied the Kangaroo invasion. After an incomplete pass attempt the ball was given to Roy Jackson who slipped through the hands of the Steers defense and scored what proved to be the winning touchdown. PAT failed and the Kangaroos led 12-6.

The next serious scoring threat by either team came early in the fourth quarter when Terry Craft blocked a punt deep in Kangaroo territory, and the Steers recovered. Three consecutive plays up the middle could only gain a scant four yards however, and on fourth and six a screen pass to Larry Erwin was just short of the necessary yardage.

Farwell fifth and sixth grades played Lazbuddie fifth and sixth grade teams Monday afternoon, Nov. 1, in Lazbuddie. First team to play, composed mostly of fifth grade boys, beat Lazbuddie 12-0.
