Telephone Expansion Finished; Statistics Show Area Growth

| The expanded telephone facilities Telegraph Company in the TexicoFarwell area went into operation last week. <br> The expansion program which was begun in mid-March has been according to the schedule drawn up when the project was in only the planning and detail stage several months ago, according to C. H. Forester, manager of the Clovis exchange. The project represents an expenditure of roughly $\$ 55,000$ with an additional $\$ 32,700$ earmarked for a later date. <br> This makes a total of $\$ 87,700$ for the present phase and the future as the need arises. <br> Forester said also that the socalled earmarking of a future expenditure as well as cables which have been installed under the present phase of the project was taken into consideration as the potential growth of the TexicoFarwell area. <br> Company records bring out the facts about the past growth, and based on these records it aphealthy state insofar as growth potential is concerned. At least, Mountain States projected itself into the future and installed what they believe to be sufficient cable to take care of all normal requests during the next five-year period. <br> Scant records which go back to 1911 show that 69 telephones were in the entire area that year. The exchange then was operated on what was termed a "home-owned" basis, wherein an individual per- | son had some money to invest and set up a community telephone system. <br> By January, 1920, telephones had slipped to 47 in Texico and Farwell, but then started an increase and have been growing ever since. Here are the number of since. Here are the number ors telephone stations over the years since that time as of the first day of the year: <br> States began operation of the system on a contract basis, Fred W. Meyers was the exchange manager at Clovis. Meyers is now retired and resides in El Paso. At the time, there was only one operator for the Texico-Farwell exchange, Mae Evett, and nine operators in Clovis with approximately 600 telephones in operation. <br> Old timers in this area will probably remember the old building which housed the exchange when the lines coming into the switchof the building that they had to be propped up in order to let cattle pass. And, like so many early buildings, the roof leaked when it rained and umbrellas were mighty handy things to have inside the building. <br> If anyone employed in the telephone exchange had whims regarding the superstition of opening an umbrella in the house, they superstition or getting a drenching. | But these things happened in what is today referred to as the "good old days." Now, in telephone communication as well as many other things, emphasis is on electronics, the modern wonder, born and nurtured by many skilled researchers and engineers. <br> It required several tons of new equipment to place the new facilities for Texico-Farwell subscribers into operation, and the figure for the dial equipment alone, not counting lines and cables, cost in the neighborhood of $\$ 17,000$, according to Forester. <br> Actually, with the new equipment in operation, just about everyone in Texico and Farwell can have the type of service they desire, and those who wish new service won't be disappointed either. This will hold true except in the most isolated cases, Forester emphasized. <br> Installation of the new facilities was handled for the most part by Western Electric Company crews. Western Electric is the manufacturingand supply unit of the Bell Telephone System. <br> Summing it up, the details and expenditures which the expansion involved are proof that another major company of the Southwest believes that Texico and Farwell will continue to grow. <br> Marion F.
