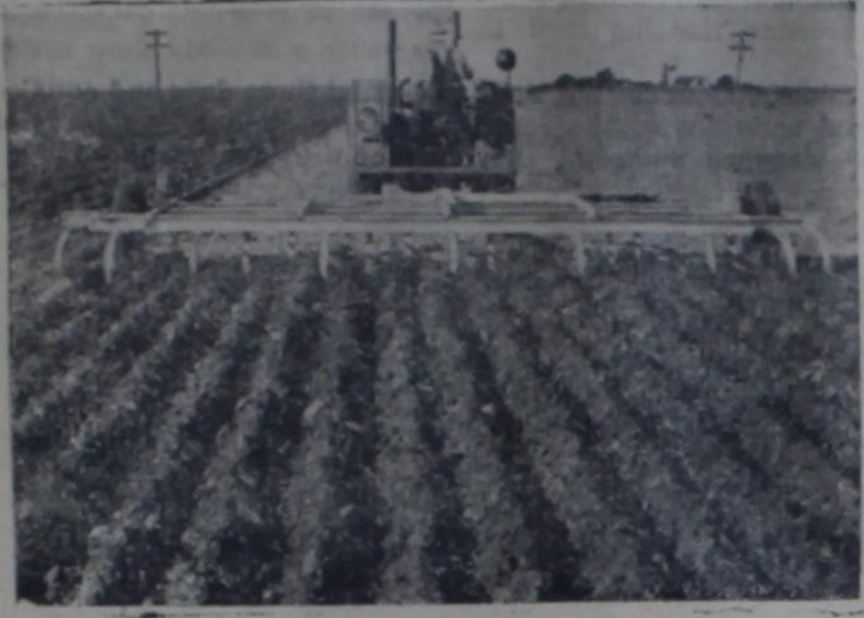

**OPA PLANS AID TO RETURNING VETERANS**

An important step in the OPA program to assist veterans in adjusting to civilian economic life was announced today by W. A. Robertson, veterans advisor in the district office.

Changes in ration regulations that will permit veterans of the present war to open small businesses making use of rationed foods—businesses which under rationing have been closed to newcomers—became effective March 26.

One type of business is that using rationed foods as raw materials and the other is establishments which use rationed foods in the service of "refreshments".

Existing regulations, Robertson pointed out, already permit the opening of certain types of new establishments dealing in food such as retail and wholesale establishments distributing rationed foods, restaurants or other institutional users, and certain establishments producing rationed foods.

The amounts of rationed food that a veteran may obtain are limited so that, in general, the businesses will be comparable to typical "small" businesses now operating, Robertson said.

It was emphasized that scarce supplies of rationed foods will not permit the opening of large businesses under the new regulation. It was also pointed out that price regulations applying to other businesses of the same type will apply

to those operated by veterans, and they should obtain information regarding ceilings before making financial commitments in connection with new businesses.

**SPECIAL ARMY TESTS AVAILABLE IN APRIL**

AUSTIN — Seventeen-year-old young men throughout Texas will have an opportunity, April 12, to take Army Colege qualifying tests for the Army Specialized Training Reserve Program, Dr. H. T. Manuel, University of Texas education professor and regional director of the ASTRP, has announced.

The tests are open to young men whose 17th birthday falls between October 1, 1944 and August 31, 1945.

and they will be held in local high schools.

Assignments to the program will be made in July, August and September 1945. Reports of the tests will be sent to Eighth Service Command Headquarters in Dallas.

**DISCHARGED VETERANS GET TWO SHOE STAMPS**

Shoe ration books issued to discharged service men hereafter will contain two valid shoe stamps, instead of the single stamp heretofore allowed, OPA announces.

The new ruling applies to all books issued by local war boards after March 28th, the district office advises.

The ration book in use for shoes

is No. 3, originally issued in the summer of 1943 and in use for shoes since November of that year. Ordinarily, all shoe stamps except the last one that became good are removed when the book now is issued to new babies, late applicants, and others who are eligible. The shoe stamps No. 2 and 3 of the airplane series will now be left in books issued veterans.

**COWBOY REUNION WILL BE HELD IN STAMFORD**

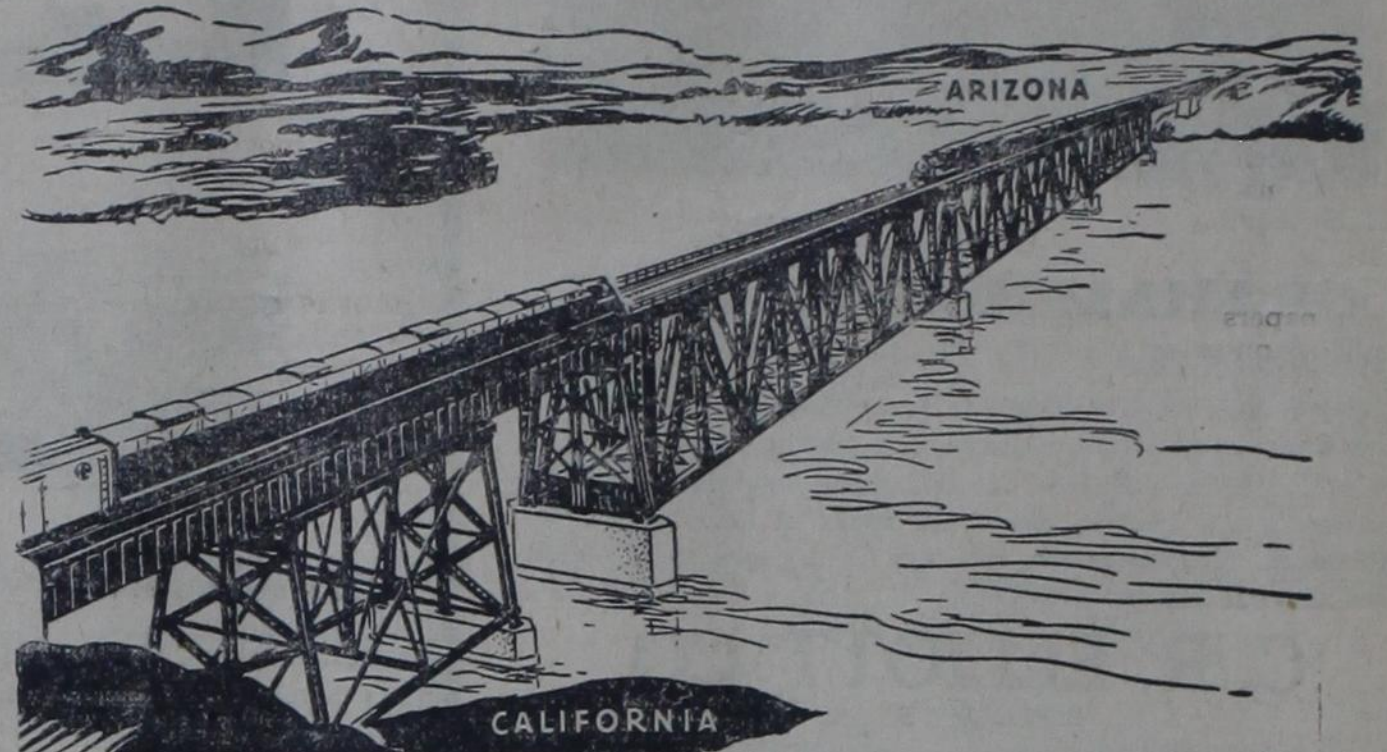

The directors announce that none of the usual activities of the rodeo would be dropped and that they

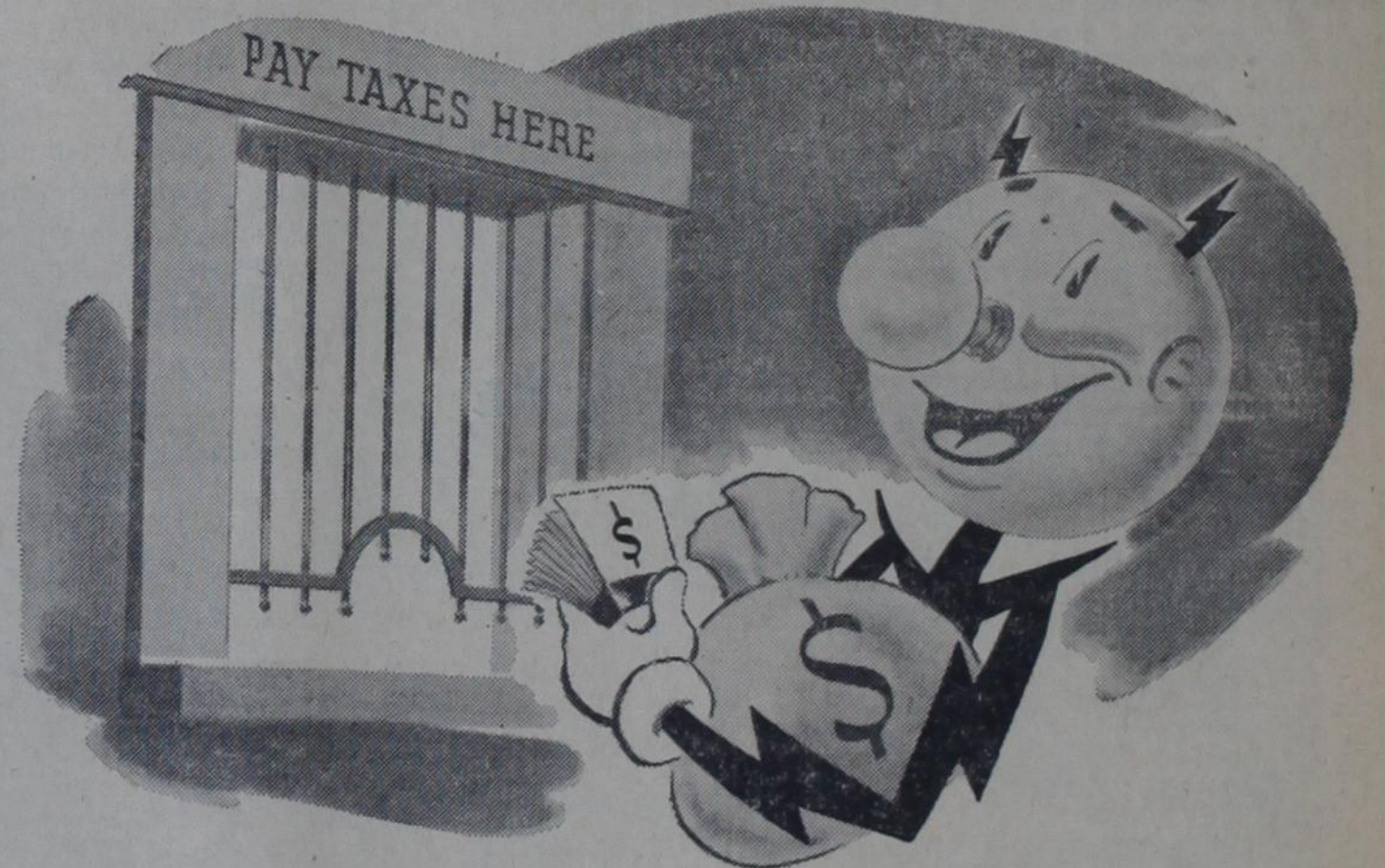
