## Health Note

AUSTIN-Lockjaw, or tetanus, a very serious disease caused by
tiny germ that looks like a stick with a ball on one end-something like a microscopic lollipop, says Dr. Geo.
W. Cox, State Health Officer. This ball is called a spore and it is the seed of the germ. Lockjaw germs
are found in the soil, especially in manured soil of the barnyard or gar-
den; in blank cartridges; etc., in

germs grow best in wounds where germs grow best in wounds where
there is considerable tissue destrucwood splimters or grains of dirt have been embedded.
Every accident seen by the physician must be considered from the lockjaw angle; and whenever there
is any question, tetanus antitoxin is any question, tetanus antitoxin
should be given, for it is the antitoxin that has helped keep the incidence of lockjaw at its low level
Your physician will advise you as to its use. Its disadvantages are that it does not get rid of the lockjaw germs in the wound; and it does occasionally cause hives and other dis-
agreeable symptoms for a few days agreeable symptoms for a few days, previous injecticns. Should lockjaw develop, it requires much antitoxin and entails great expense; and eve
then, not all cases can be saved. It is not possible to free the en-
vironment of lockaw germs, but now there is a method of active immunization. The subject becomes his own manufacturing establishment for
titoxin to combat lockjaw poison titoxin to combat lockjaw poison.
One nice feature about the tre ment is that it can be combined with diphtheria and whooping cough prophylaxis. The concurrent immuniza-
