Dangerous hands that must be handcuffed to keep them from activity are the servants of an undisciplined mind or soul: Have you trained your mind to think cleanly and helpfully? Have you cultivated a good will toward others? Do you meditate upon the possibilities for good which lie before you? Have you dedicated your soul to the service of God and of your fellow men? Then we shall rejoice that your hands are free; they will be symbols of untold value. Do you think only of your own success, without taking other men into account? Are you concerned only to have your own way and to look after your own pleasure? Then society will do well to lock your hands to each other. Offer your hands to God in prayer and to your fellows in helpful service. But first you will need to lay your soul, your mind, upon the altar of reverent worship.
