Texico stresses

The Texico City Council held a special meeting on Monday night to pass an ordinance and a resolution. The city will hold an election on March 4 for two council positions. Jerry Bradley and Doug Scioli are incumbents. The resolution had to be passed by a quorum, but due to holiday schedules, this was the best time to get the council together to do it. The council also agreed to use paper ballots in this election instead of the computers. For smaller cities, it is legal to still use the ballots.

The council also passed an ordinance to restrict water usage and fines of up to \$300 for repeated violations of the policy. The ordinance is broken down into four stages of water savings.

Stage 1, a voluntary water conservation measure, asks that residents not water their lawns between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. and that odd numbered addresses water on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday while even numbered addresses water on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. Water runoff from sprinkler systems is prohibited. Stage 4, or the highest mandatory level, includes no car washing, refilling pools or watering lawns along with other restrictions. The city is currently at stage 1. In other news, the council:


-- Received a request to put up two flag poles at the entrance to the cemetery. The Veterans Administration would supply the flags. Prices will be checked on.


