

NEWS FROM THE FARM BUREAU

Bovina Farm Bureau, meeting last Monday night, asked us to publish this fact: "There is a law in Texas requiring that immediately upon abandoning a well, it shall be filled up or securely covered. If you do not voluntarily do this, your county attorney may, at the request of any citizen, call upon you, serving papers demanding that you comply. This is, of course, simply a safety first law, and we are sure if you think, that you won't leave an abandoned well unprotected. If you know such an open hole, please call the owners attention to it immediately.

A complete report on the good Bovina Farm Bureau meeting appears elsewhere in this paper.

S. B. 24 passed the Senate and to a third reading in the House. An amendment similar to a feature in H. B. 3, which Farm Bureau vigorously opposed, was killed before Senate passage. This amendment sought to force local districts to match minimum foundation funds on a one-fifth and four fifths basis, creating a continuing increase in local taxes to support a program set by the state with no control by local authorities. Responding to a telegram from the Farm Bureau Legislative Office in Austin, Farmer and many more county Farm Bureaus wired their opposition strongly enough to knock this devastating amendment off the bill. Your school superintendent or county officials should be able to tell you how much money successful organized effort means to your school district in this one case. Thank Aubrey Ellison, chairman of your county legislative committee for prompt attention and action in this case.

H. B. 441, making possible continued use of surplus commodities, and consequent continuation of the school lunch program is supported state wide by Farm Bureau. Your county and State Farm Bureau also urge passage of S. B. 167 and its companion H. B. 427 in an effort to eradicate vesicular exanthema in hogs. This must pass to avoid jeopardizing the market for Texas hogs, since states to which we ship have already passed similar legislation.

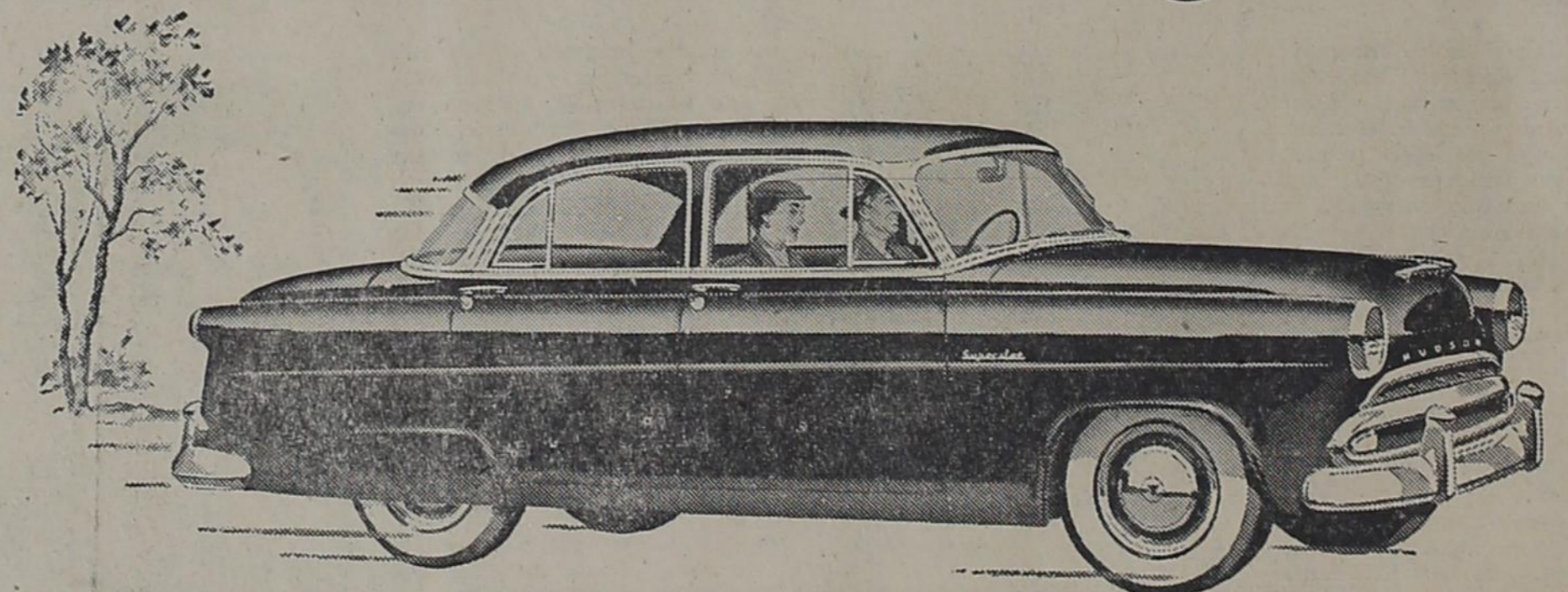

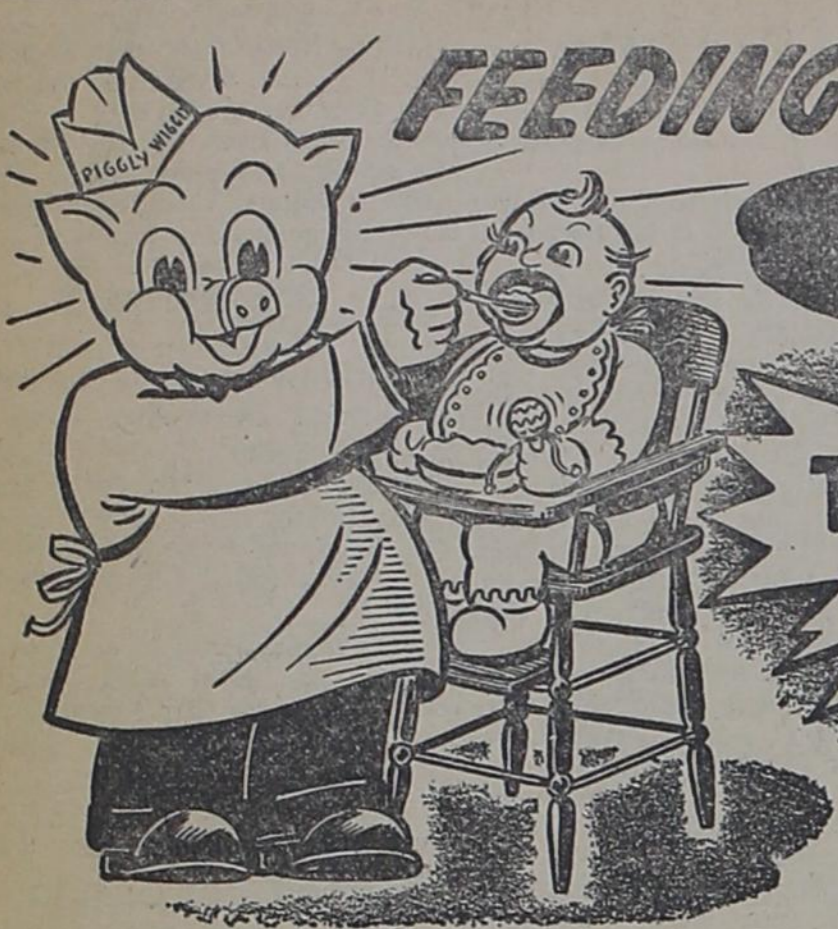
