| What could in the future turn out to be one of the most important elections of some time is slated for Saturday, September 29th, when Parmer County residents will have an opportunity to decide whether or not they wish the creation of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District 1. <br> Taken at a casual glance, the election may not seem to have much importance. Residents can decide at this time if they want to set up a board which, if the situation ever arses, could have something to say rigation wells. However, that's the short view. What actually will be decided is whethel locals want to retain this controlling power at home, or whether they are sufficiently uninterested to skip the election, let the proposal die and if -just if-water ratioming should selves in the position of receiving orders from a state board as to how much, when and where they might irrigate. <br> Farseeing farmers and civic-minded men have been working for some two years to line up that state in individual districts to stress water conservation and take whatever ac future, and on the last Saturday of this month, the proposals of these individuals go before the public in general. <br> Specifically, two ballots will be available to the eligible voters at this time. One carries two propositions: for or against confirmation of the district(which in this case includes Parmer, Bailey and Castro | rector for Precinct No. 3. The other ballot gives voters this choice: for or against authorizing the board of directors (providing, of course, that the district is approved) to levy a tax not to exceed five cents per $\$ 100$ valuation. <br> Jess M. Osborn, of Muleshoe, is currently serving as temporary director of Precinct No. 3, and interested residents in this city were of the opinion this week that Osborn's name would be selected for director in the balloting. <br> Eligible to cast ballots are Parmer county residents who have paid poll taxes, who live within the county and who have rendered property for taxation in the proposed district. <br> Absentee ballots are now available at the office of County Clerk Loyde Brewer, and may be requested and filled out through Tuesday September 25th. According to Brewer, ballot boxes will be maintained in all regular voting precincts of the county-Bovina, Farwell, Lakeview, Friona, Rhea, Black, Lazbuddy and Oklahoma Lane-on the 29th, with two boxes in each in corporated city, one for rural resi- dents and one for voters residing within the city limits. <br> County residents, discussing the fending electionthis week, decided to hold a "free air" meeting at Bovina on Monday evening, Sept. 24. at which time questions pertaining to the pros and cons of the election will be discussed.
