Conserving water in the kitchen
About one-quarter of all household water use can be traced to the kitchen and laundry room. But with just a few adjustments, families use cut the amount of water they Here are some of the water-sav ing suggestions: Cut down on the number of uten sils used in preparing meals and on
the plates and glassware used with the meals themselves. Plan more one-dish meals in which vegetables are cooked or baked in little or no added water, and save nutrients
too. Because a kitchen faucet can deliver five gallons of water a minute, find ways to avoid running water. For example, use a pan of water to
wash fruits and vegetables instead of doing it under the tap. If you wash dishes by hand, use a dish pan and rinse all the dishes at onc Find ways to make double use water. Ideally, the liquid from cooking vegetables and other food should be used again as stock fo
soups or broth. But even if you don't intend to use it for cooking, don't

Washing dishes by han Washing dishes by hand requires anywhere from 8 to 20 gallons of
water. A dishwasher typically use between 12 and 16 gallons of water, so the dishwasher should not auto matically be considered a water waster. However, a dishwasher
uses the same amount of water whether it is completely full or only partially full, so it pays to wait until the dishwasher is loaded to capac-
ity.
