Farwell receives applications Wolverines stay alive for police chief's position

The Farwell City Council on Tuesday was told that the deadline for applications for the police chief's job is March 17.

Current Chief Robert Achterberg leaves at the end of February.

So far, nine applications have been received.

The city has budgeted for two police officers but the council hasn't made a decision on whether to go that route.

Councilman Wayne Gruben said Achterberg was receiving about 10 calls a month, which doesn't justify two cops. But when he was off duty, Farwell was only "covered" at night by the sheriff's department -- which had a deputy in Friona, 25 miles away.

If two good applications are received, the council may hire two officers.

In other business, the council:

-- Agreed to a request by Farwell firemen to seek a Texas Forest Service grant (which pays up to 90 percent) for a brush truck, estimated to cost \$120,000.

If that doesn't work, a smaller brush truck is available for about \$60,000.

If the loan is okayed for the bigger truck, the fire department and city would split the local cost for \$12,000.

-- Agreed to purchase computer equipment, costing \$3,000 a year, to help quicken EMS billing procedures.

-- Heard that an open house may be held in the spring in an effort to get new members for the EMS and fire department. Cargill Cattle Feeders will donate the meat.

-- Approved buying new office furniture for City Hall for \$2,000.

--Okayed a covered patio for Judy Pena at 400 6th St. -- Will have Steve Meeks do various community center repairs for \$7,187.

-- Will look into a graffiti ordinance, ordering property owners to repair such damage.






