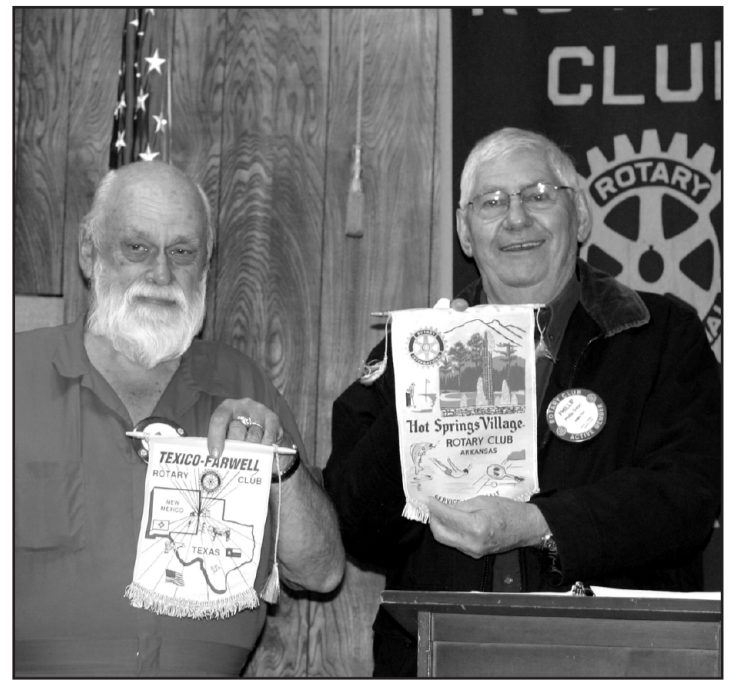
**Aubree Williams**

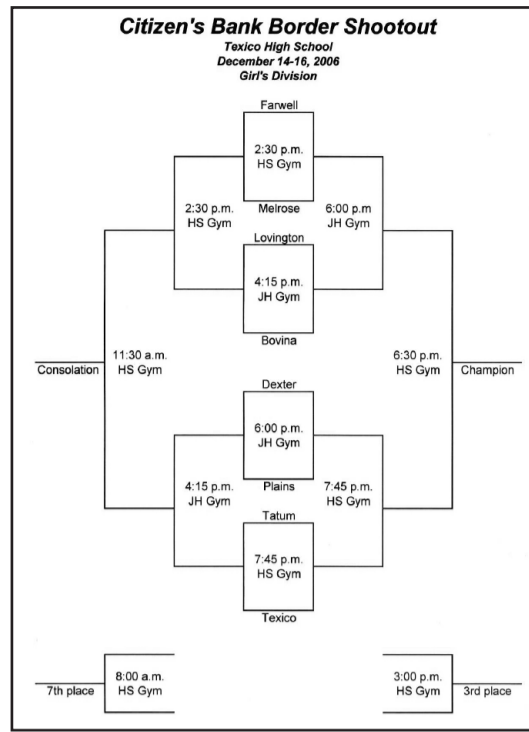
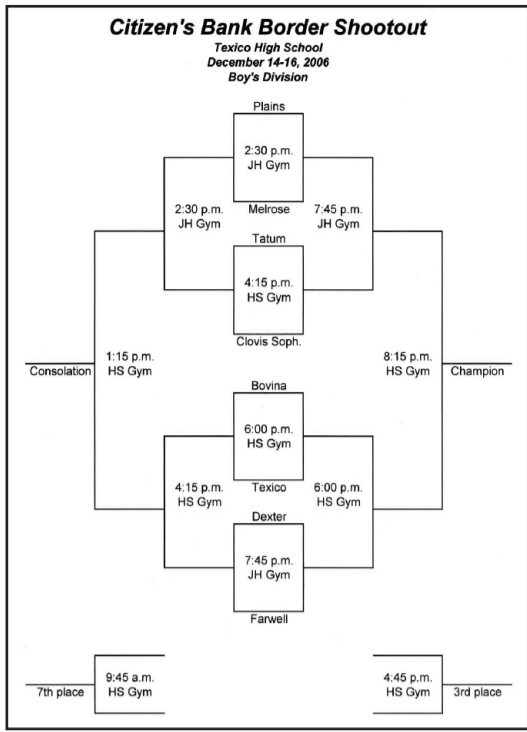

Our speech and debate teams competed Dec. 1-2 at Amarillo. Advancing to the semi-finals in poetry was Annette Torres. Nina Galvan placed 7th overall in finals in prose, while receiving a 1st in her preliminary round of impromptu. Competing, but not advancing, were Mikaela Cenicerros, in poetry, and Adrianna Gutierrez, in domestic extemp.

In CX Debate, Lauren Beaubien and Jourdan Kirkland placed 3rd out of 20 teams, receiving another 2 TFA points. They have already qualified for TFA state contest this year.

Blake O'Hare and Alicia Porter went 2-1 as well as Kade Foster and Cameron Kirkland. They did not

advance to the out rounds. In LD Debate, Ashleigh Mesman was 3rd out of 29 debaters, earning four more TFA points. She now has 6 points and is only 2 away from state qualifying.

They are the only 8th grade team competing in the West Texas Tourney Circuit. this year and face high school teams each meet. We are very proud of them because they are already getting a lot of recognition from other coaches for their improvement.

## LEGAL PUBLICATIONS

### RESOLUTION AND PROCLAMATION OF REGULAR SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION AND PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TAX ELECTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Texico Municipal School District No. 2 (herein the "Board" and the "District", respectively), in the County of Curry and State of New Mexico, has determined that a Regular School District Election and Capital Improvements Tax Election, (herein, the "Election") be held on February 6, 2007, pursuant to Sections 1-22-1 through 1-22-19, NMSA 1978; and

WHEREAS, the term of office of Bruce Mayfield, Position 1; Byron Mayfield, Position 2; and Jim Pena, Position 3, will expire on February 28, 2007.

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that 3 positions on the Board are to be filled at such election by submitting to the qualified electors of the District the names of candidates qualified to appear on the ballot for election to the positions to be filled; and

WHEREAS, the persons who desire to fill such positions on the Board shall be required to file declarations of candidacy or declarations of intent to be a write in candidate, all in accordance with Sections 1-22-1, et seq, NMSA 1978; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 22-25-3, NMSA 1978, the Board has determined, and does hereby determine, that there should be submitted to the electorate at said Election, the question of whether or not a property tax of \$2.00 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value of property allocated to the District under the Property Tax Code should be imposed for the property tax years of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012, for the purpose of capital improvements in the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TEXICO MUNICIPAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 CONSTITUTING THE GOVERNING BODY OF SAID DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTIES OF CURRY AND ROOSEVELT AND STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. On the 6th day of February, 2007, there will be held in the Texico Municipal School District No. 2, Curry County, New Mexico, a regular school district election for the purpose of submitting the names of candidates for the 3 positions to be filled on the Board to the respective qualified electors of the District and for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the District the question of whether or not a property tax should be imposed for the purpose of capital improvements in the District.

Section 2. The Voting district for this Election shall be as follows:

Voting District	Precinct Nos.	Polling Place
1	Curry County: those portions of 1, 2, 30, 33 and 35 which are in the School District Roosevelt County: those portions of 1 and 3 which are in the School District	Community Center 215 North Griffin Street Texico, NM

In addition, there will be an Absentee Voter District established as described in Section 10 herein.

Section 3. The polls for said Election will be open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on the day of the Election.

Section 4. At such Election, the following at large positions on the Board shall be filled by the qualified electors of the District, to-wit:

Position 1: For a four-year term starting March 1, 2007; and  
Position 2: For a four-year term starting March 1, 2007; and  
Position 3: For a four-year term starting March 1, 2007.

Section 5. A declaration of candidacy for membership on the Board to be filled at the Election shall be filed with the County Clerk of Curry, the proper filing officer, during the period commencing at 9:00 a.m., December 19, 2006, being the third Tuesday in December, and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the same day, pursuant to Section 1-22-7, NMSA 1978.

Section 6. In making a declaration of candidacy, the candidate for membership on the Board shall submit a sworn statement of intent in substantially the form provided in Section 1-22-8, NMSA 1978.

Section 7. A person who desires to be a write-in candidate for membership on the Board at such election shall file with the County Clerk of Curry County, a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate before 5:00 p.m. on January 2, 2007, being the thirty-fifty day preceding the date of the Election.

At such Election, the following question shall also be submitted to all qualified, registered electors of the District:

#### PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TAX QUESTION

"Shall the Board of Education of the Texico Municipal School District No. 2, County of Curry, State of New Mexico, be authorized to impose a property tax of \$2.00 per each \$1000.00 of net taxable value of the property allocated to such District under the Property Tax Code for the property tax years of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012 for the purpose of the following capital improvements in the District, i.e., erecting, remodeling, making additions to, providing equipment for and furnishing school buildings, purchasing or improving school grounds and purchasing computer software and hardware for student use in public school classrooms; maintenance of public school buildings and public school grounds exclusive of salary expenses of employees of the District; and purchasing activity vehicles for transporting students to extracurricular school activities?"

Section 8. The tax contemplated by the capital improvements tax question shall be in addition to the tax contemplated by the bond question and to any tax imposed to pay debt service on the bonds or for any other purpose. Such capital improvements tax shall be authorized pursuant to the Public School Capital Improvements Act, i.e., Sections 22-25-1 through 22-25-10 NMSA 1978 (being Chapter 5, Laws of the New Mexico, 1975, Special Session, as amended and supplemented).

Section 9. A person is a qualified elector of the District if he or she is a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age on the day of the Election. In order to vote, qualified electors of the District must have previously registered with the County Clerk of Curry County or Roosevelt County. Absentee voting will be permitted in the manner, authorized by Sections 1-6-1 et seq., NMSA 1978 and 1-6A-1, et seq.; provided, however, that pursuant to Section 1-22-19, NMSA 1978, qualified electors may also vote absentee in person at the office of the County Clerk of Curry County, during the regular hours and days of business from 8:00 a.m., January 12, 2007, being the twenty-fifth day preceding the Election, until 5:00 p.m., February 2, 2007, being the Friday immediately prior to the Election.

Section 11. Voting shall be by marksense paper ballots, which are to be tabulated by an M-100 Optech Tabulator. At least one voting machine shall be used at the polling place for each Voting District.

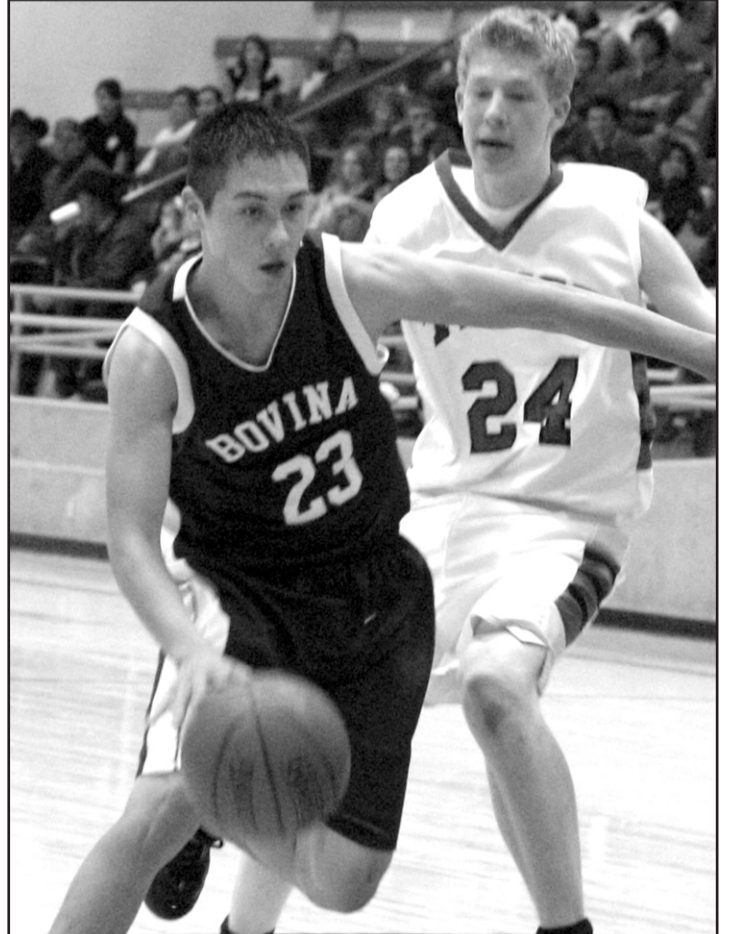

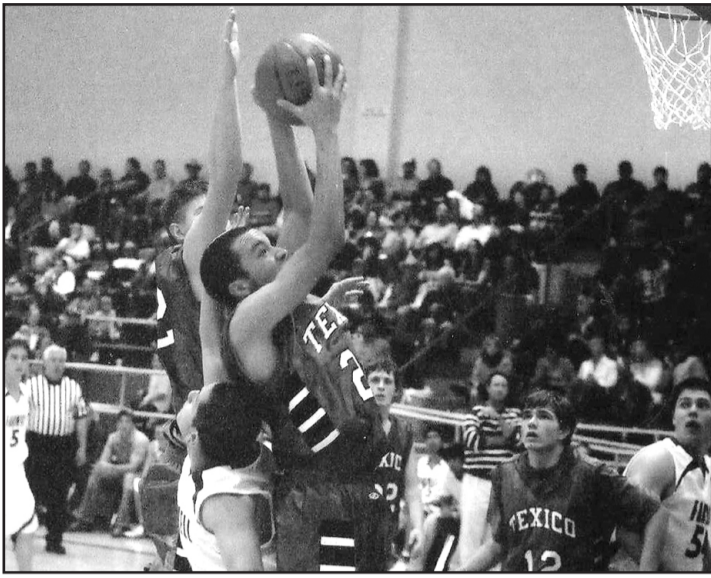

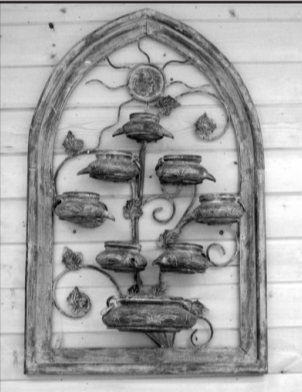

## State writes up Texico for residents' illegal dumping

At the Texico City Council meeting on Tuesday, City Street Supt. Darrell Stanton reported that the city has been written up by the state for people dumping trash outside of the city dump.

He is putting up an additional 1,000 feet of fencing to try to head off the illegal dumpers.

The public is asked to call the police department if you see someone dumping at night, or dumping outside of the fence.

The city has looked at purchasing land that would allow them to fence the property at the road, but one of the landowners involved will not sell.

In other news, the council:  
- Heard from Councilman Oran Jay Autrey that Engineers Inc. will pay the city \$5,980 for the mistake made in the water project that is ongoing. Autrey met with them, and forced the issue since it wasn't Texico's fault that the plans were not finished.

- Discussed putting together a comprehensive plan for the city. This is needed when going after state grant money. Some of the items that the council will look into include sewer line upgrades, wastewater treatment plant upgrades, updating water lines, curbs and gutters to help with water flow in the city, improving the swimming pool, and plans in case the city grows to include parks and other necessities.

The idea of improving Wheeler Avenue to make the city look a bit better was supported.

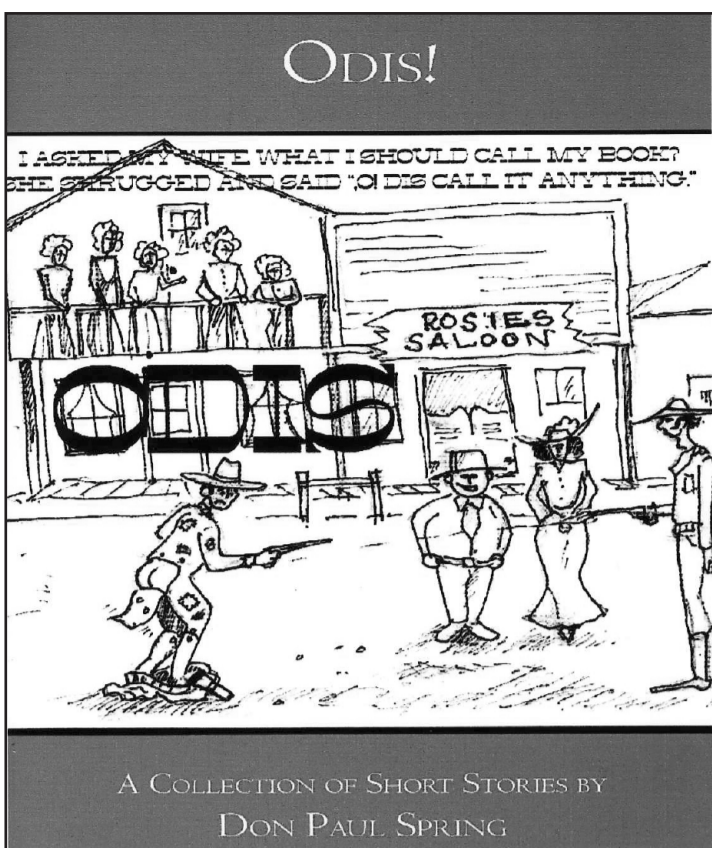
**Bovina High science lab to be remodeled**
