I am writing to you in the hope that the citizens of Farwell and surrounding area will read this and respond to the need of the Farwell Fire Department for additional members

Our department was organized in 1955 by several concerned citizens who realized the need of a fire departDepartment provided fire protection for Farwell.
Department provided fire protection for Farwell.
Over the years, we have grown and provided fire pro-
tection for Farwell and surrounding area of Parmer County. In 1966, a volunteer ambulance service was added and staffed by firemen. The Farwell EMS split off of the fire department in 1988.
The Farwell Volunteer Fire Department has grown to meet the needs of the local taxpayers, with the full support of the City Council, and the Parmer County Commissioners Court, to now have two Class A pumpers, a brush fire truck, a 4,500-gallon tanker, a rescue equipment truck and a suburban (for weather watch duties and school attendance travel).
My purpose in writing this letter is for people to understand our need for ADDITIONAL FIREFIGHTERS.
Our membership numbers are down to a critical point, mostly due to people moving out of town. Three of our members are over 75 years of age, one is 65 and two are
bumping 60 . bumping 60
We have gained five new members in the last two years who have been a great addition and are very dedicated. But they are all employed out of town and not readily available during the daytime hours.
We tried recruiting new members at Border Town Days with a display of our equipment. Our firemen gave a demonstration of our Hurst rescue tool. Several people came by to receive giveaway materials and toy fire hats for the kids, but only three people showed any interest in becoming a firefighter.
I urge anyone who has a concern about having the need of the Farwell Fire Department to respond to your call for help to get in contact with any fireman or the Farwell City Hall. And we will be glad to inform you as to how you can HELP.

## From Monti Vandiver

Much needed precipitation was received in most of the Northwest Plains this week. Local weather stations recorded .20-2.73 inches and individual reports exceeding 4 inches were received. Still, some areas received only minimal rainfall.
Area wide, the Northwest Plains received only $55 \%$ of normal precipitation from January thru July based on long term weather data (1971-2000). The resulting $45 \%$ deficit may not tell the whole story. Rainfall events which were received, came in small increments which limited their effectiveness.

The Friona weather station did not record any rainfall within a 24 hour period in excess of 1 inch in 2006 till Aug. 14. The Muleshoe station only recorded three rain16, and one June 23 . 16, and one June 23.
Recent precipitation will not likely have a great impact on many summer crop yields but are none the less extremely valuable in that pumping costs can be reduced. Pumping costs exceed $\$ 10.00 /$ acre inch thus a addition to any yield enhancement. Irrigation costs have addition to any yield enhancement. Irrigation costs have
been reported to have reached $\$ 300.00 /$ acre in some area corn fields.

## Texico charts city improvements for the future

Third, they plan a reconstruction of the city streets to include curbs and gutters starting in 2009, a new pool in
