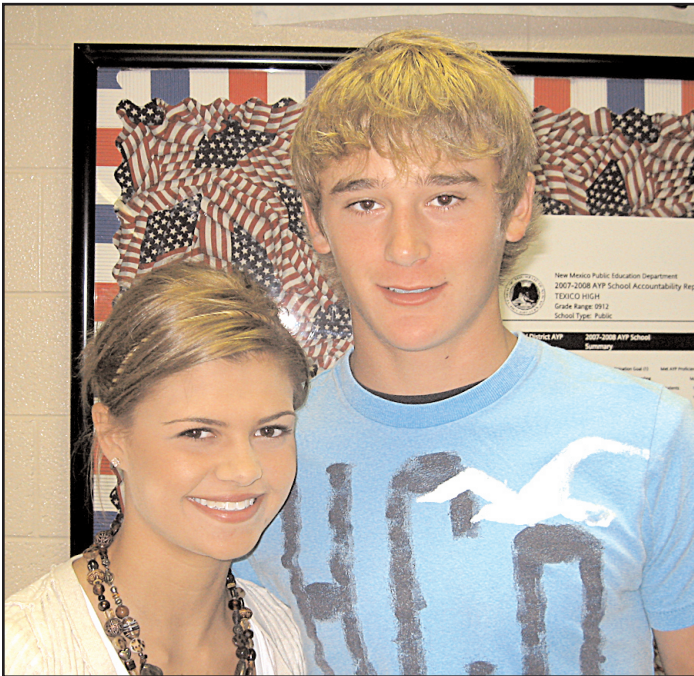

With 10 games right were:

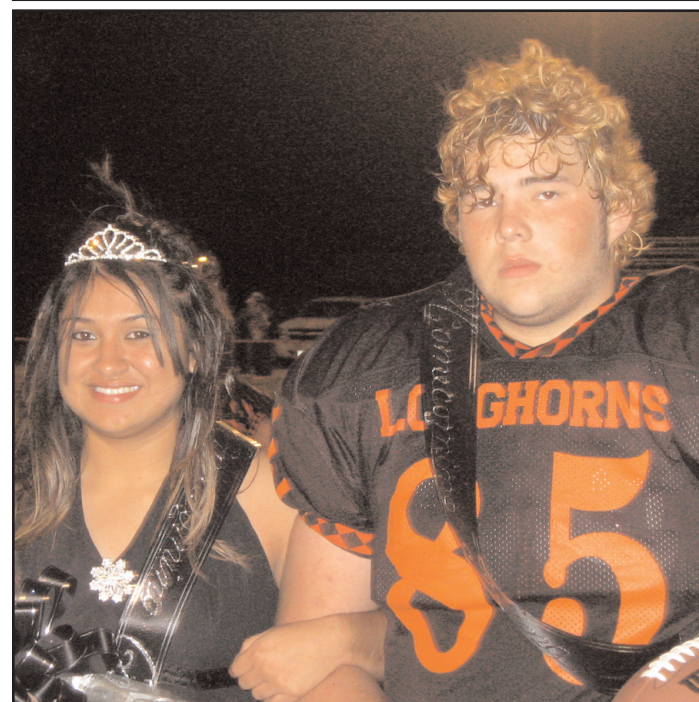

Our problem is that they make geopolitical decisions for our nation, and that has been a disaster.

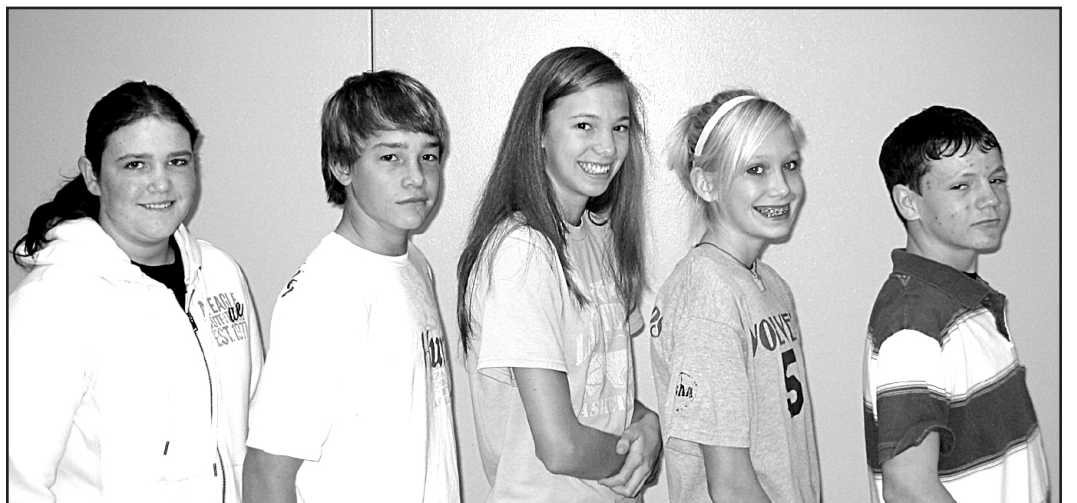
When are our leaders

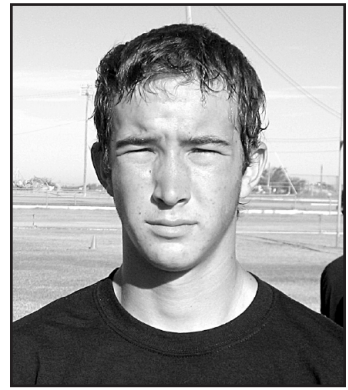
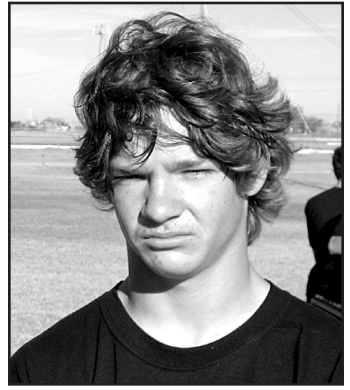

Longhorns have fun Homecoming

It was a joyous Homecoming at Lazbuddie Schools on Friday as the Longhorns pasted Klondike, 59-30. It was Lazbuddie's second victory of the season.

The Longhorns got off to a 12-0 lead in the first quarter on two TDs by Steven Pacheco, on runs of 45 and 3 yards.

Klondike put two scores on the board in the 2nd quarter but they were answered by Lazbuddie, on TD runs of 30 and 43 yards by Jason Davis. Jorgane Galvan kicked for 2 extra points also, and Lazbuddie went into halftime ahead, 28-16.

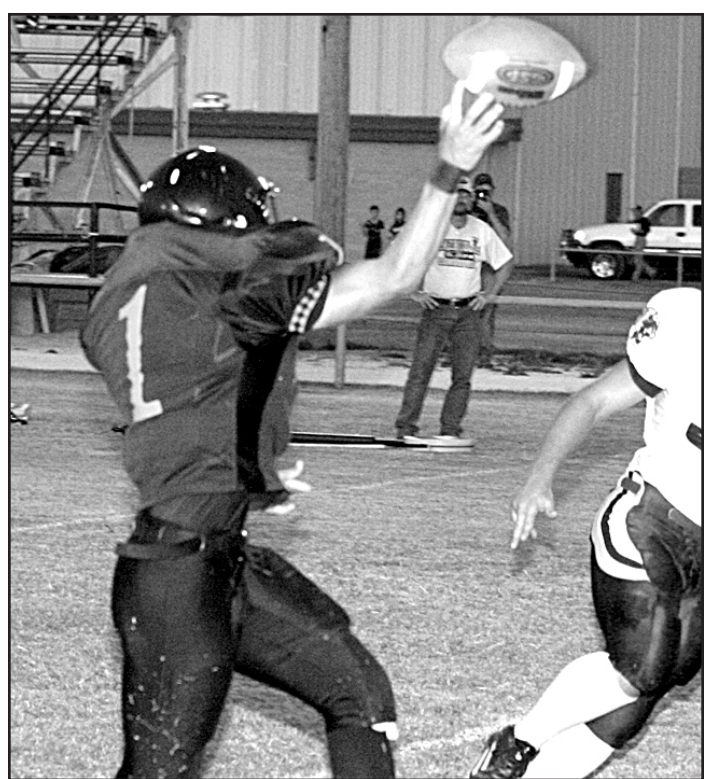
The third quarter saw two more Lazbuddie TDs -- on runs of 15 yards by Davis and 55 yards by Pacheco.

In the final period, Klondike scored twice while Lazbuddie put up three scores -- on a 17-yard interception return by Devlin Thompson, an 8-yard run by Pacheco and a 35-yard run by Riley Smith.

Extra points were added on a Galvan kick and a Davis run.

Pacheco carried 22 times for 263 yards, while Davis ran 11 times for 138 yards.

Team stats: 1st downs - Lazbuddie 16, Klondike 11; rushing yards, Lazbuddie 452, Klondike, 59; passing yards - Lazbuddie 74, Klondike 148; and penalties - Lazbuddie 3 for 25 yards, Klondike, 4 for 20.

FFA and 4-H have public speaking events for those of us who like to talk, numerous hands-on projects for those who enjoy creating something out of nothing, and endless chances to meet people and make new friends every step of the way. All of these help build self-confidence, increase responsibility, and develop respect.

As I have already said, there are several other

extra curricular activities offered that present opportunities to students, and as I also stated, each benefits the student in their own respective ways. However, as I have gotten the chance to become more involved in both 4-H and FFA, I have seen and experienced what a difference a "nudge" from your ag teacher or a challenge from your County Extension Agent can make in the life of a young person.

If you are a student reading this, I challenge you to go and talk an ag teacher or extension agent, and see what all there is to get into in FFA and 4-H. You will be

amazed at the diversity of each organization and the lasting friendships that you will make in them.

For parents, I challenge you to stay involved with whatever it is that your child endeavors. There is not a single person on earth who has the influence that you do in determining the success of your child.

Finally, there are many you I need to say "thank you" to for all of your support over the years. After a couple of months here at college, I realize how lucky I was to grow up in such an amazing community with such quality people. I am forever grateful, and want you all to know that I cannot thank you enough for all that you have done for me, and for helping me "live to make the best better."

How to help stop crime

Frances Kube, who heads Parmer County Crime Stoppers, stopped by the Tribune the other day and dropped off some information to help fight burglaries.

As we have been reporting for the past several months, our area has had an outbreak in burglaries, from Lazbuddie to the Twin Cities.

Some likely can be contributed to folks in Muleshoe and Clovis; others to folks who live in our area.

Some have been caught; others will be.

But what can you do? Here are some things to be on the lookout for:

- Unusual sounds, such as screams, shouts or barking dogs. Make it a habit to look outside, especially when you are awakened at night by strange noises. If you sometimes get up in the wee hours of the morning, look out your back window toward the alley.

- Anyone going door to door, looking in windows and parked cars. A person trying a door to see if it is locked or looking into a window could be a burglary.

- Unknown persons in your neighborhood. Never open your door to anyone you do not know. Always verify who they are by telephoning the company they represent and asking why they were sent to your home.

- Property being taken from a business or home by someone you do not recognize. You could be witnessing a burglary. Contact law enforcement.

- Parked or slow moving vehicles with no apparent destination or lights, especially in the early morning hours. This could be a thief waiting for an opportune time to rob one of your neighbors.

- Anyone being forced into a vehicle, or a stranger talking to a child. You could be witnessing an abduction.

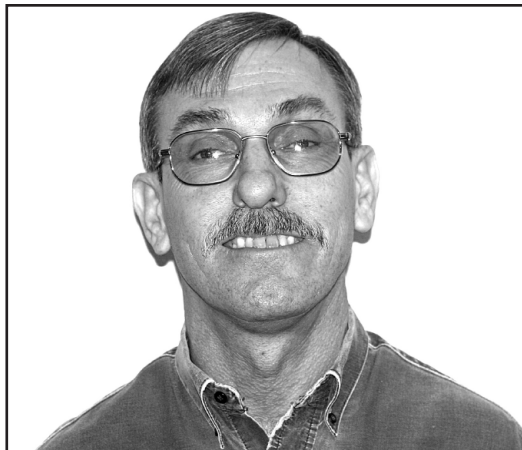

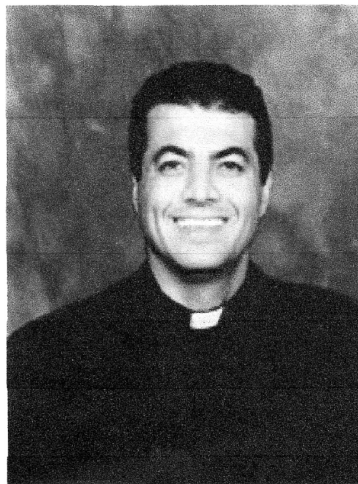

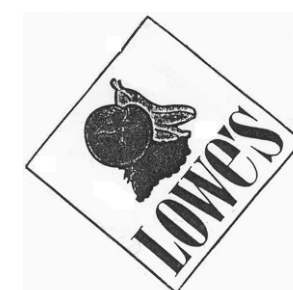
