Branch collects major cutting title

Pete Branch, of Farwell, aboard six year-old MS Peppy Cat owned by Lonnie and Barb Allsup, captured the 2008 Open Stampede cutting in Calgary, Canada, on July 10.

Branch, who has never traveled to the Stampede previously, was definitely attracted by the added money. "I want to congratulate the Stampede on wanting to add that much money to an open cutting. It's great to have somebody who has the courage and foresight to see what can happen."

Peppy Cat is the present-time leading horse in the nation in open cutting. "Probably counting the money I've won here that gives me a \$60,000 lead over the 2nd place. It's pretty unbelievable. What I'm doing is trying to set the record of most money earned in a year on her. Hopefully I'll get that. She's an amazing horse," credits Branch who trained her as a two year-old.

Overcoming some soundness issues with the mare early on, she's never looked back. Branch and Peppy Cat posted solid, consistent high-scoring runs throughout the competition. "That's what makes her such a great mare. This is the 102nd cutting she's been to this year and I've only lost 2 cows on her."

Branch was attracted to the sport of cutting as a young teen and has been training now for 41 years and now has a Stampede Cutting buckle to add to his esteemed collection.

The bleach got in their eyes and Travis swallowed some. After that they used goggles.

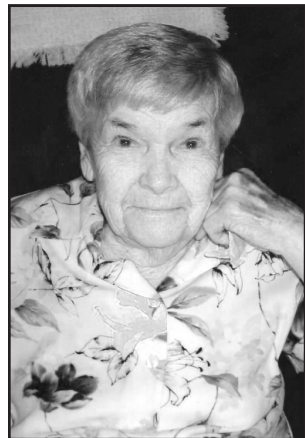

Sign-ups being taken for BTD decorated bicycle contest

All youngsters are reminded that registration is open for the Border Town Day's Decorated Bicycle contest.

Youths must sign up at the State Line Tribune, 404 3rd St. in Farwell

-- Two brand new bicycles are being given away. Tedson Trailers and Master Tech Auto Service, both of Texico, have donated the two bicycles. One is for a boy and one is for a girl.

This year's BTD them is "Tribute to Education." It is important to follow the theme since that is a large part of judging.

Also, an anonymous donor has provided funds for cash prizes to be given away in each category.

"Everything is ready at the Tribune for kids to register," said Lisa Sanders, who will honcho the annual bike contest, assisted by Elizabeth DeLeon.

The registration deadline for the contest is at 4 p.m. on July 24.

Ms. Sanders said that youths planning to enter the contest need to register, giving their name an age, to be eligible for all the prizes.

The contest will be held one hour before the Border Town Days parade kicks off on Saturday, July 26. The contest takes place adjacent to the Citizens Bank branch in Texico. Entrants need to be here at 10 a.m. Texas time.

After the bicycle contest ends, all participants will ride in the parade to the Farwell City Park.

Prizes will be announced at the beginning of the day in the park activities at 12:30 p.m. Texas time, at the Farwell City Park gazebo.

All participants need to be on hand at that time to

receive their prizes. No motorized bikes are allowed in the contests.

All riders must bring their decorated bikes and trikes to the west side of the Citizens Bank building in Texico by 9:45 a.m. Texas time.

Room is available for the contest, and the Texico City Council has approved closing the street next to the bank to traffic during this time. Thus, there will be complete safety for the kids during the judging.

"You must be on time or you will not be judged," alerted Ms. Sanders.

She added, "Contestants need to be sure to stick to the theme -- "Tribute to Education" -- if they are going to be counted. The judges will be looking for adherence to the theme."

The contest is open to all youths who live in the Texico and Farwell School districts. Also, the BTD committee allows children and grandchildren of local folks to enter also, even if they live elsewhere.

There are two categories -- 7 and under, and 8-12 years of age.

Other rules are:

-- All participants ride the parade. Their folks can go along too. The parade ends at Farwell City Park and a bicycle rack will be set up just across the street on the property of First Baptist Church of Farwell.

-- Riding bikes in the park during BTD is not allowed, for safety reason.

-- You must be present at the park to receive your cash prizes (or if you win the bicycles!) when the announcements are made during the 12:30 p.m. ceremonies.

Communism replaced?

The President of the Czech Republic, Vaclav Klaus, was forced to endure decades under the dictatorship the Soviet Union had inflicted on his own country.

When Soviet Communism finally collapsed in 1990, the Czechs joined the rest of Eastern Europe in celebrating the departure of its occupying armies and the dismantling of the spirit-crushing authoritarian rule they had enforced.

That was then; this is now. President Klaus sees a new danger in the world today, and in February, he gave an interview to a Czech newspaper warning of the newest world threat to human dignity and individual freedom.

His years under a Communist dictatorship, coupled with the trials of his nation's recovery after its collapse, have given Klaus a deeper sense of the treasures that an independent national sovereignty, individual rights, and democracy really are. They have also given Klaus an unimpeachable credibility in making this warning.

Klaus' interview was lengthy and detailed, but key quotations are provided here.

"As someone who lived under communism for most of my life, I feel obliged to say that the biggest threat to freedom, democracy, the market economy and prosperity at the beginning of the 21st century is not communism or its various softer variants."

"Communism was replaced by the threat of ambitious environmen-

talism."

"This ideology preaching earth and nature and under the slogans of their protection - similarly to the old Marxists - wants to replace the free and spontaneous evolution of mankind by a sort of central (now global) planning of the whole world."

"The so-called climate change and especially man-made climate change has become one of the most dangerous arguments aimed at distorting human efforts and public policies in the whole world."

"I am convinced, however, that up to now this scientific debate has not been deep and serious enough and has not provided sufficient basis for the policymakers' reaction. What I am concerned about is the way the environmental topics have been misused by certain political pressure groups to attack fundamental principles underlying free society."

"It becomes evident that while discussing climate we are not witnessing a clash of views about the environment but a clash of views about human freedom."

Sincere environmentalists play an important role in the world today, of course. Their tireless and sincere devotions to life on this planet have preserved species that may have otherwise been lost forever. However, it has been said more than once, "the new Red is indeed Green." After all, any hobo can jump on a freight train.

The clean-cut stranger knocking on our nation's door saying he wants to cut energy usage in half has to give a reason why. If he responds all nations must be reduced to dependent status under an autocratic one-world domination, the door is slammed in his face.

So instead, the clean-cut stranger knocking will speak only of saving butterflies for the happy

children frolicking in the gardens under the protective gaze of Gaia the earth goddess. When he dabs the tears from his eyes and starts crooning Kumbaya, that old song from summer camp days, it sounds beautiful and he is invited inside.

And that's the danger. Once that pleasant introduction gets him over the threshold, he may very well stop singing Kumbaya and pick up a new tune. If he clenches his fist over his head and starts belting out L'Internationale, the traditional anthem of one-world socialist domina-

tion, it may be too late to push him back outside the door.

President Klaus recognizes this threat, based on his own life experiences, and he gave that interview to the Czech newspaper to warn the world that you need to check the clean-cut stranger's credentials more carefully before you invite him inside.

No American newspaper or TV news show reported President Klaus' warnings. But they should have, and Americans should take a moment to reflect on them.

The committee voted to raise the fee (for 2009) for arts and crafts participants from \$15 to \$20. This is the first such hike in many years.

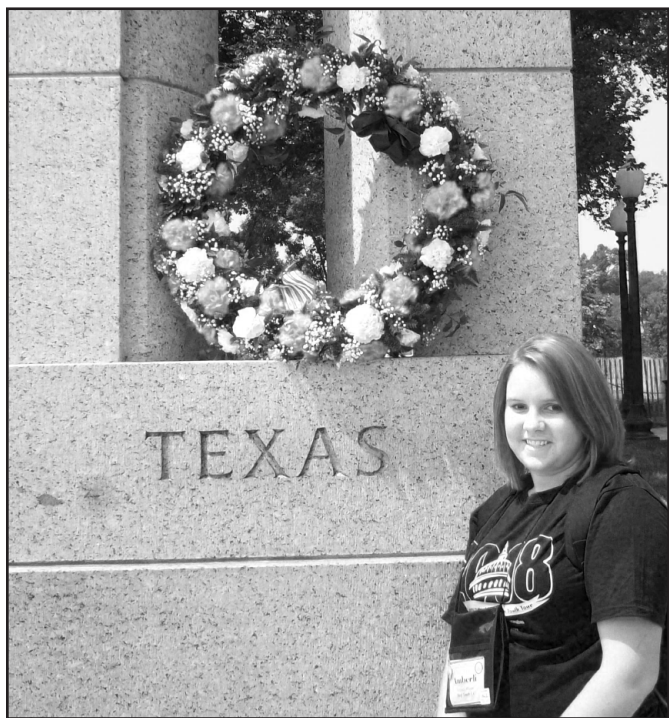

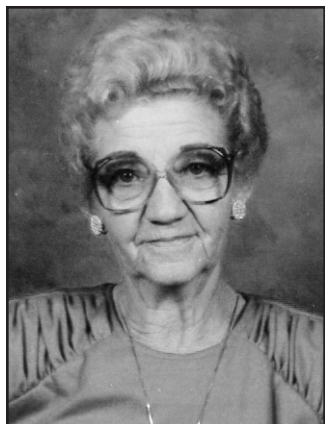

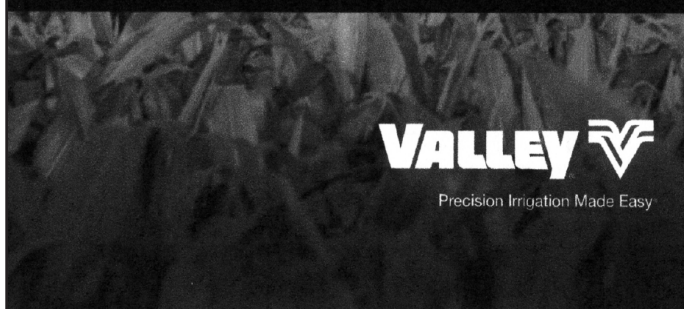

Farwell City Council tightens up center rentals

The Farwell City Council on July 15 approved changes in the Community Center rental agreements that tighten the cleanup and "no alcohol" provisions.

All dances and receptions must have security, with arrangements to be made with Farwell police.

A complete set of the rules is available at City Hall. In other business, the council:

-- Heard City Inspector Lee Hutchins report that possible solutions to the drainage problem in the 100 block of 1st Street are being discussed with the railroad.

Hutchins also reported that a house in the 200 block of Avenue A has been cleaned up and the broken windows covered.

Audit shows Parmer County in great financial shape

The Parmer County Commissioners on Monday received a most favorable audit report for 2007 from the Kirkland CPA firm in Farwell.

The audit showed that the ending balance had increased \$428,822. The county's total (according to the accrual accounting method) showed \$6,036,933.

But this figure is misleading because that method of accounting takes into account a variety of monies, including accounts receivable.

If you want to know how much "cash" the county had on hand at the end of that fiscal year, the total is about \$2,840,000.

Of this total, about 10 percent is "restricted money." That means it has to go toward specific purposes. For example, money collected from fines going toward security purposes.

Also, the audit showed that the county has about \$3 million in debt, of which \$2.8 million (plus interest) goes toward the jail. This is

being paid out through 2023.

Thus, the audit, which was accepted by the commissioners, showed that the county is in outstanding financial shape.

Last year, the county did not raise taxes, although higher assessed valuations caused increases to property owners. This year, the same may happen.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Approved plan options offered through Blue Choice for county officials and employees health insurance benefits.

-- Heard Bill Stovell say the Parmer County Industrial Development Corporation, a Friona group, plans to issue revenue bonds to finance a waste water project for the John Visser dairy.

-- Accepted the resignation of Vi Hutto, Justice of the Peace for Pct. 2, the Bovina area.

The resignation is effective Aug. 15, but Mrs. Hutto may still do some of this work until a

successor is elected.

The Friona area JP post is open due to the death of Valton Howard.

For both JP posts, write-in candidates will be placed on the November election ballot.

The filing period for this is July 27 through Aug. 22. Candidates must file with County Judge Bonnie Heald at the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell.

No political affiliations will be used in these two elections.

The filing fee is \$375, or to have a petition presented with at least 50 names.

From Monti Vandiver, Parmer County extension agent - IPM:

It seems that the planter has been the most used implement thus far this season. Replanting operations are all but complete, time has run out to plant most crops. Established crops are progressing pretty well.

Corn is ranging from 2-3 leaves to tassel in maturity. Recent cool temperatures are near perfect for pollination.

Texico schools okay dual credit policy

The Texico School Board on Monday approved a dual credit policy with Clovis Community College, ENMU and Mesalands College in Tucumcari.

Basically, here is what it means:

Texico students can take college classes (for free) at the high school or at the colleges and get high school and college credit for them.

For complete details on how dual credit works, parents and students are asked to contact high school principal Keith Durham or high school counselor Robbie Allred.

In other business, the board:

-- Heard Supt. R.L. Richards report that the \$2.8 million bond issue election will be held on Sept. 9.

The entire project is expected to cost about \$8 million. The state will pay 66 percent of the cost and Texico Schools is responsible for the remaining 34 percent.

School officials will explain the bond issue to folks attending the annual Community Cookout at the school cafeteria on Aug. 22.

Planned is a new building for the kindergartens and the cafeteria.

-- Hired Mike Thomas a junior high teacher and boys' coach.

-- Hired three instructional aides: Edie Kalbas, Elva DeLeon and Miribel Jaramillo.

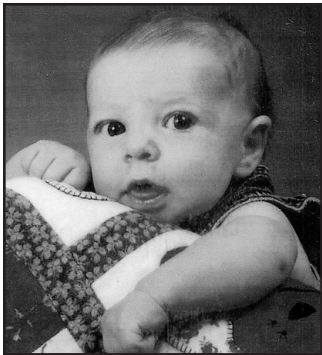

Important information regarding the Medicare advantage plans, Medicare drug benefit And Parmer County Community Hospital & Friona Rural Health Clinic

New types of Medicare Plans were approved in 2005 under Medicare Part C. These are also called Medicare Advantage plans, and are a form of managed care for Medicare beneficiaries. These plans offer benefits which differ from the original Medicare and also have different deductibles and co-pay requirements, depending on the plan. A Medicare Advantage Plan is different from regular Medicare. It is often an HMO or PPO, where your choice of doctors, hospitals, and home health agencies is limited. Medicare Advantage also includes Private Fee for Service ("PFFS") plans. If you sign up for any Medicare Advantage Plan, you are no longer in the original Medicare payment system.

In addition, your physicians and your hospital have to be separately signed up as "providers" under the Medicare Advantage plans for you to be able to use them as an "in-network" provider and get the deductibles and co-pays that the Medicare Advantage plan promises. However, many physicians and hospitals are not signed up as providers, and you may not be able to use them without paying more out-of-pocket than the plan promises. You cannot use the regular original Medicare while you are signed up under a Medicare Advantage plan.

The new Medicare drug benefit (separate from Medicare Advantage plans) took effect on January 1, 2006. You may also have been enrolled in a drug benefit plan that may affect the Medicare hospital services you receive. There are many choices in Medicare drug plans. You can sign up for a separate drug plan and keep the original Medicare. However, many Medicare Advantage plans offer a drug benefit plan as well, and if you sign up for the drug benefit, you may have also signed up for the Medicare Advantage plan without realizing it.

Certain people that have both Medicare and Medicaid may be automatically enrolled in an Medicare Advantage HMO or PPO. If so, you have the right to choose whether you want to go back to regular Medicare or stay with an HMO or PPO. If you chose to sign up with a Medicare HMO or PPO, you have the right to change back to traditional Medicare. You should check to see if you have been enrolled in one of these plans.

In summary, enrollment in a Medicare Advantage Plan, or for Medicare drug coverage through a Medicare Advantage plan, can affect your hospital services. It can lead to your being charged more for the cost of Medicare services that the plan does not cover. Parmer County Community Hospital and Friona Rural Health Clinic do not participate in any Medicare Advantage Plans, so please let us know if you have enrolled in any Medicare Advantage Plan or in any drug plan before you request services.

If you plan to use Parmer County Community Hospital and/or Friona Rural Health Clinic as your hospital and primary care service, before you sign up for any new plan please contact us to determine whether or not you can still receive "in-network" services at Parmer County Community Hospital and/or Friona Rural Health Clinic and whether your own out-of-pocket expenses will increase. We at Parmer County Community Hospital and Friona Rural Health Clinic want to continue to serve your health care needs, and we do not want any misunderstanding to occur regarding your Medicare benefits or out-of-pocket costs.

In other business, the council:

-- Heard all was quiet on getting a new city manager, although there is one person considering sending a resume.

-- Heard Bovina Economic Development Commission President Jeff Steelman report on recent BEDC activities.

This included three BEDC members attending a training session last spring at Mesquite, Texas; extending BEDC Director Larry Hodnett's contract for six months; and a possible truck wash-type facility coming here.

-- Discussed whether to raise cemetery plot prices. Currently, it's \$300 a plot and the city cares for it forever, although donations are sought to help with the upkeep. Mrs. Scaff was asked to check other towns' prices before a vote is taken.

-- Discussed whether to buy a new police vehicle. It was learned that repairing the current unit would cost \$5,000, so the council is going ahead to

get a new vehicle.

A special meeting was held on July 11 to accept the bid for a 2008 Ford Explorer for \$25,577, through government sales.

-- Police Chief Leon Saddler give a Letter of Commendation to new deputy Nick Upton for his role in arresting a suspect in an aggravated assault case last month. Upton was able to get the suspect under control without having to fire his weapon.

-- Agreed to suspend the effective date for the Xcel Energy rate hike until a final decision on it is made by the state agency.

-- Set the next meeting for Aug. 11.

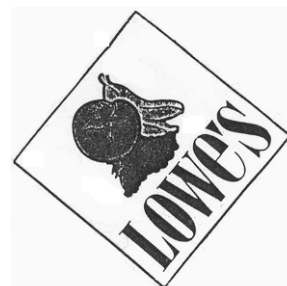
