Horne retires

Golden Library at Eastern New Mexico University in Portales commemorates Dr. Floyd D. Golden, an early president of the school. After retiring from ENMU, he moved to Amarillo and attained more honors for his work with senior citizens. He and his wife, Elsie Arlene, have connections to Parmer County. They taught at Friona School early in their careers.

Elsie Pool Golden (1900-1997) was the sister of Lenton Pool, a Farwell school teacher and principal was later was a cashier at Security State Bank.

Lenton and Lauretta Pool had four sons – Jerry, Rex, Don and Sam. Sam Pool studied architecture at Texas Tech and helped design the International Space Hall of Fame at Alamogordo, N.M. He added luster to his career as the state architect of New Mexico at Santa Fe.

Tommie Snodgrass, who died recently, contributed recipes to "Feeder's Digest I, II and III", the cookbooks published by the Texico Women's Club in the

1970s. These cookbooks enlarge Texico's bibliography. That is to say, more than 160 books mention Texico.

Dr. Joe Horne ended 35 years of ministry when he recently retired as senior pastor of First Baptist Church in Clovis.

He came to preach at the First Baptist Church of Texico via Cannon Air Force Base. His family occupied the newly built parsonage at 316 Turner St., north of the church, in 1978.

The Horne children, Howard, Laura and Craig, graduated from Texico High School. Their mother, Margaret, who died in 1992, is buried in Texico Cemetery.

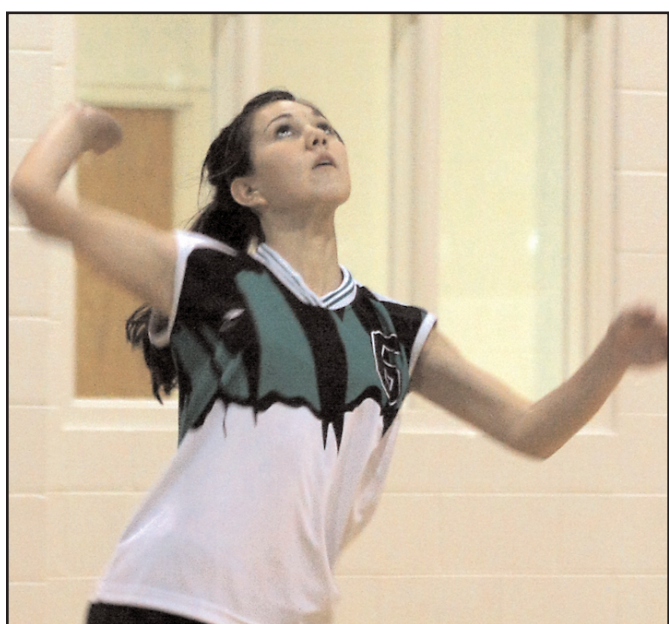
EARLY DEADLINE

Are you eligible for telephone discount programs?

To assist qualified low-income customers obtain and maintain local telephone service, several payment or discount assistance programs are available from Five Area Telephone and West Plains Telecommunications. Under these assistance plans, qualified low-income applicants may receive a 50% discount off telephone installation charges for new service installation and customers that qualify may also be eligible for a discount of as much as \$13.50 off their monthly local telephone bill.

Lifeline Service Program

For eligible customers, the discount will apply only to basic telephone service. This discount does not prevent you from subscribing to optional telephone service such as Custom Calling Service (i.e, Call Waiting, Caller ID); however, the discount rate does not apply to these services or any other charges.

Link-Up America

Link-Up America is an assistance program designed to assist qualifying consumers in reducing the charges for initial installation of telephone service. Those qualifying for Link-Up will be given a 50% discount on service charges up to \$30.00 for installation of new service to the customer's residence. If you do not have a telephone or if someone you know does not currently have telephone service, please contact Five Area Telephone or West Plains Telecommunications for information on discounts available on service connection charges under the Link-Up America Program.

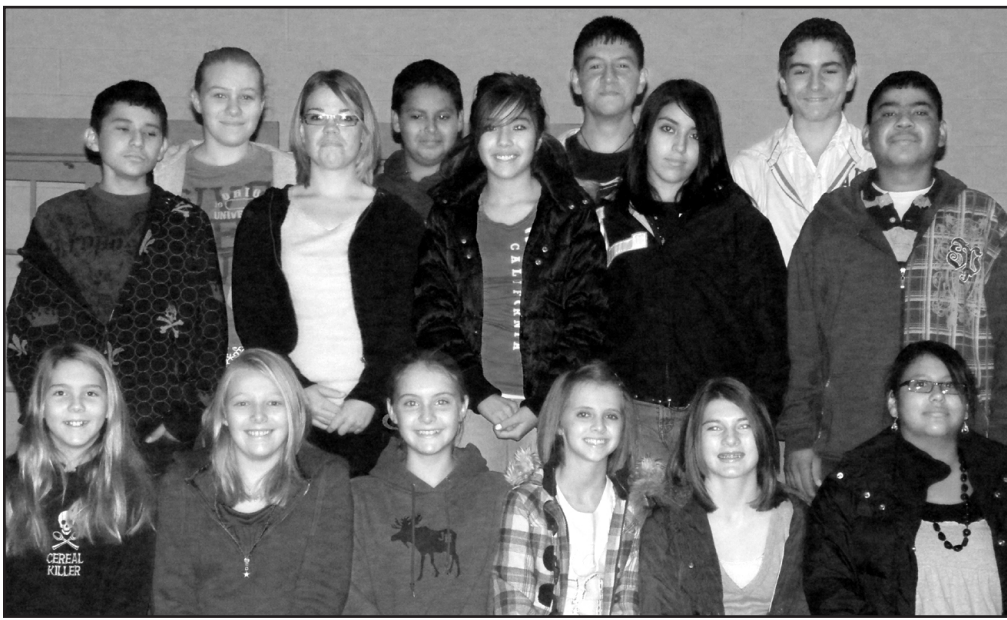

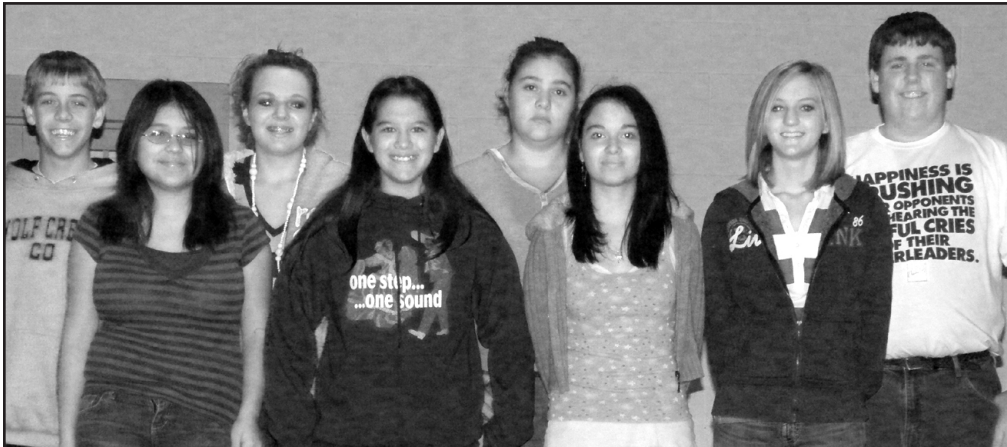

Wolverines blast Bears in quarter-finals

The Texico Wolverines ran over the Cloudcroft Bears 39-7 Friday at home in the state quarter-finals.

The Wolverines head to Santa Rosa on Friday, Nov. 21, at 7 p.m. for the state semi-final game.

The Bears started off on offense, but a tackle behind the line of scrimmage by Mark Rivera and good defense stopped them and punted to midfield.

On Texico's first play, Meza took the ball 69 yards, with a half dozen Wolverines surrounding him, all the way in for a TD.

On defense, Estrada sacked the QB for an 8-yard loss, and the Bears punted. Then Cloudcroft intercepted a tipped ball.

Estrada knocked down another pass, but the Bears completed a long pass to the 40, where the receiver fumbled and Posada recovered.

Texico scored again to start the second quarter as Bailey, Meza and Posada combined again to run over the Bears defense. The score was 18-0 with 11 minutes left in the 2nd quarter.

The Bears next possession was stopped by a Meza interception at the 21.

The next drive featured 10-yard runs by all three Texico running backs and a short reception by Bailey as the Wolverines marched 79 yards. It was capped off by a one yard Bailey TD. With the extra point, the score was 26-0.

On the kick off, Texico exploited a hole in the Cloudcroft return formation as Warren Faircloth snuck in to get the ball back on the 44 yard line. Bailey ran over three or four defenders on a 25 yard reception that helped set up Anderson for the score.

The Bears changed their kickoff return formation, and Texico almost recovered another onside kick. Jonathon Montano and Kevin Visser both knocked down passes, then Anderson intercepted to give Texico the ball back.

Meza had a great run on the next series, and the Wolverines went into halftime up 32-0.

In the second half, the Wolverines started off with a great return by Brandon King to the 35. Meza had a 30 yard run, then punched it in on the next play to make it 39-0.

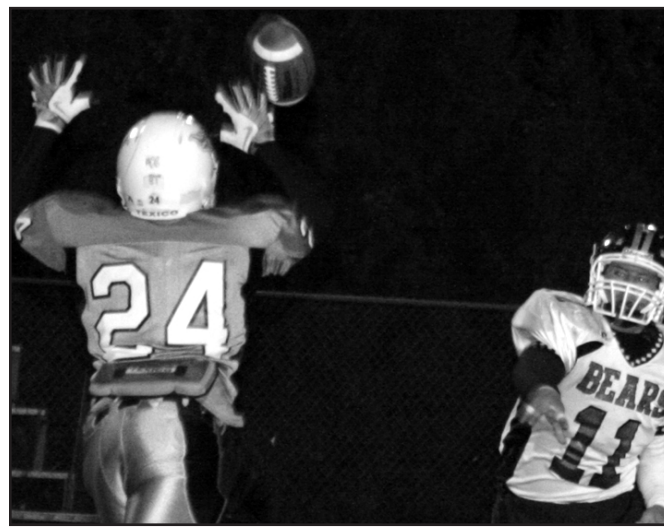
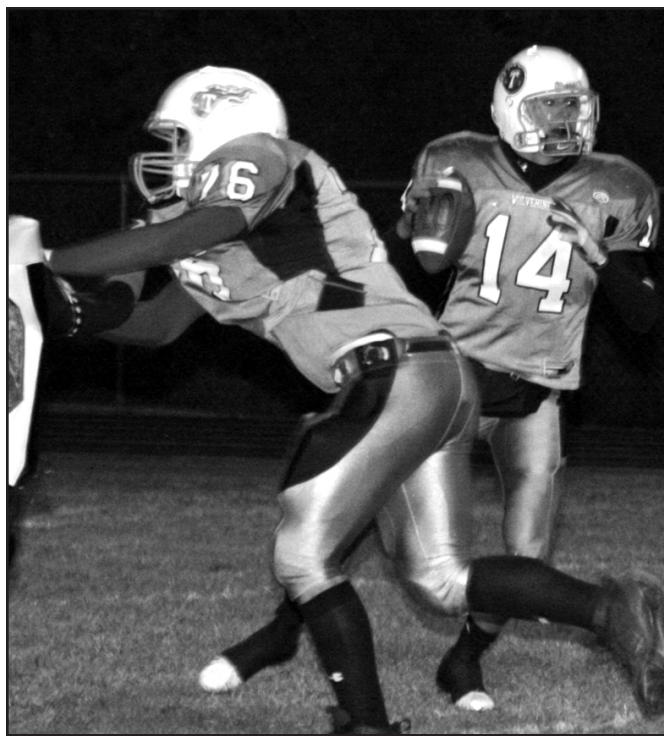
At this point, Texico pulled out many of the starters. And the Bears scored on a 10-yard pass.

The water shed draws that transverses Parmer County were the highways of the trade routes. They were named the Comanche Trail and the Comanchero Trail. We know it today as Catfish Draw and Running Water Draw.

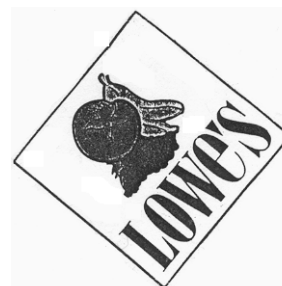
