Brandon is now stationed on North Island Naval Air Station at Coronado Island in San Diego. Harry was also stationed on North Island in the Navy in 1949-1950 at the same base. A Plane Captain was in charge of the planes. He got the planes ready for the pilots and took care of them after the flights.

Over 50 years ago, Farwell's Harry Sheets was a stationed with the U.S. Navy in San Diego, Calif. This past summer, he got the opportunity to relive some old memories, and make some new ones while visiting his grandson.

Harry's grandson, Brandon, of Muleshoe, is a lieutenant in the Black Knights Squadron of the HS-4 Helicopter squadron in San Diego stationed on the aircraft carrier, USS Ronald Reagan.

When the aircraft carrier is returning to the U.S., the Navy will sometimes allow family members to join up in Hawaii and ride back to San Diego.

Harry, with his son Gene Sheets, Superintendent of Muleshoe Schools, spent several days on board as they crossed the Pacific Ocean. Their tour went from the control tower, where Gene got to personally give Brandon the okay to lift off, to the insides of the carrier where 3,000 U.S. servicemen work each day.

## A burning question

The Parmer County Commissioners on Monday discussed a question involving the county's burn ban for unincorporated areas through April 14.

At the previous meeting, they had allowed exceptions including burning trash in earthen pits on days if it's foggy, drizzly or rainy; and for below ground incinerators with proper mesh covering, and if the winds are less than 10 miles per hour.

Farmers were also asked that when they burn stubble to contact their county commissioner, county sheriff and local fire department -- for notification purposes only.

But some confusion has arisen over a state authorization covering planting or harvesting of crops. Apparently, that may only cover sugar cane.

So the county has asked the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for a ruling on who is liable for a burn during planting or harvesting, and the TCEQ hasn't gotten back to them yet.

In other business, the commissioners:

-- Received 2,500 tons of ground-up asphalt from the state transportation department. It will be split between Pct. 3 (Farwell area) and Pct. 4 (Lazbuddie area). These gifts are alternated each year. Pcts. 1 and 2 got the donation last time.

-- Okayed early branch voting dates for the March 4 primary: Feb. 19 and 26 in Friona and Feb. 21 in Bovina.

## Dowsing finds 30 unmarked graves in Texico Cemetery

The Cemetery Association gave their semi annual report to the Texico City Council on Jan. 22, and Margie Crooks said that 30 unmarked graves have been found by a dowser brought to look for graves that were not previously listed.

Dowsing is often used to find water, but Shirley Cator, of Elida, used two sticks that moved closer together to find unmarked bodies earlier this year.

Cemetery Board member Marcia Leavell said, "It is amazing to see this in person." She also said that two of the graves have been tentatively identified. This was done by using the dowsing information and family plots to figure out who was buried in the spots.

Mrs. Crooks said that the association will probe the spots to confirm the information in the future.

The cemetery board went over projects that are in progress, including a gazebo, an enclosed display case, and a sign with cemetery rules. One project that was completed is the flag pole that is now up.

They also said that Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad has done some work on its crossing that needed disrepair.

The association asks that people refrain from taking glass of any kind, including vases, out to the cemetery. Besides being difficult to mow around, many vases break, leaving glass for city workers to pick up.

They also asked about the Texico ordinance for keeping graves clean. Several residents have brought out items that are not supposed to be there. The council agreed to give residents 10 days to clean up the items, after being notified, before they are cited to appear in court for up to a \$100 fine.

Councilman Doug Scioli said, "I hate to put someone who is trying to do something for a loved one in this position, but it has to be done." Mowing and accidental breakage were cited as reasons for the ordinance.

In other news, the council:

- Spoke to Tony Bogusz of Junk Be Gone, a Clovis firm, about cleaning up items dumped in the alleys around town. Scioli pointed out one dumpster where people have recently left a couch, a refrigerator and other items that Duncan Disposal does not pick up.

The council stressed that if you have an item you need to get rid of and you don't have the means to do it, call City Hall and they can have it picked up. It only costs \$10 for most items, and it will keep them from having to raise everyone's garbage rates in order to pay for the few who are dumping illegally.

- Voted to hire poll workers for the city election.
- Discussed the upcoming EMS conference that several Texico EMS workers go to each year. There are currently 17 EMS certified residents in Texico, but several of them have not responded to an EMS emergency in some time.

Councilman Oran Jay Autrey questioned whether they should be allowed to go to the conferences if they were not going to help when they were needed. He said, "I don't want this to amount to a paid vacation for people who are not interested in helping when they are needed. They must go on calls locally."

Scioli said he and Fire Chief Lewis Cooper will put together a board and look into the situation. He agreed that it looked like some people were taking advantage of the situation.

- Received a city budget review from City Clerk Carolyn Johnson. The city appears to be within

budget for the year.

- Allowed Cooper to buy a laptop for the fire department for training programs.

- Will look into the highway co-op proposal for 2009 at the next meeting. Autrey suggested working on the roads on the south side of town around Avenue F next year as they will be working on the north side of town this year.

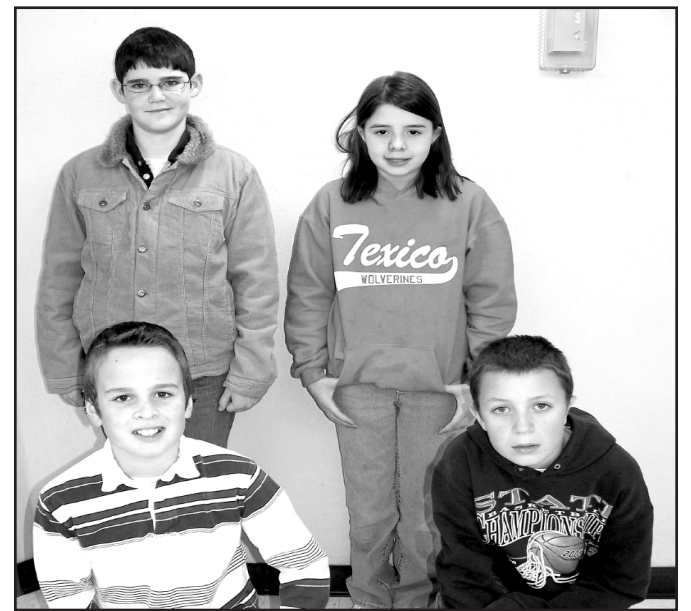
Because there were less than eight teams entering this competition, Farwell has entered a 4th team, per constitution rules.
