LUTIE, Okla., Nov. 29 (P)-Lives of thirteen miners were sacrificed to cruel King Coal shortly after noon today in the second major Oklahoma mine disaster in less than five weeks.

The miners were killed in an ex-plosion at the Number 5 mine of the Hailey-Ola Coal Company a mile and a half cast of here in the foothills of the San Bois mounains. Four other men trapped in the same entry. Number 10 1-2 cast, escaped with burns.
