An Easter Sermon Written For The Herald

Matthew 27:45-46. "Pilate said unto them, 'Ye have a watch: go your way, make it as sure as ye can.' So they went, and made the sepulchre sure, sealing the stone, and setting a watch."

This reference to the attitude of Pilate confirms what the account of the trial of Jesus had already revealed—that he had more wisdom than courage. He was wise enough to see that there was no fault in Jesus, wise enough to make the right statement for the accusation over the cross of Jesus. But he had not enough courage to back his decisions at the most vital point.

Whether it was in irony that he made this statement of the text "Make it as sure as ye can" or whether he had an idea that there was more to this Man of Galilee than they thought and that a guard would be needed, we cannot be sure; but the precautionary measure he allowed the Jews, turned out to be the most positive proof that he actually did conquer death, and made it one of the best substantiated facts of all history.

The last part of our text furnishes the perfect alternative outline, taking it in just the order Matthew gives it to us.

'Make It As Sure As Ye Can'

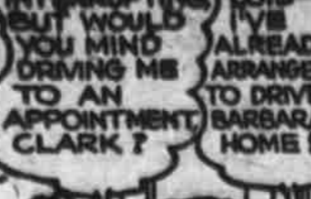

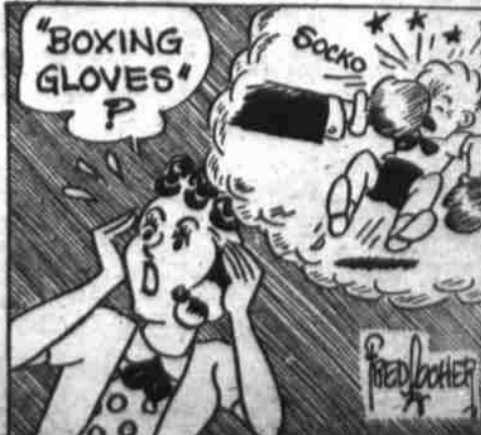
