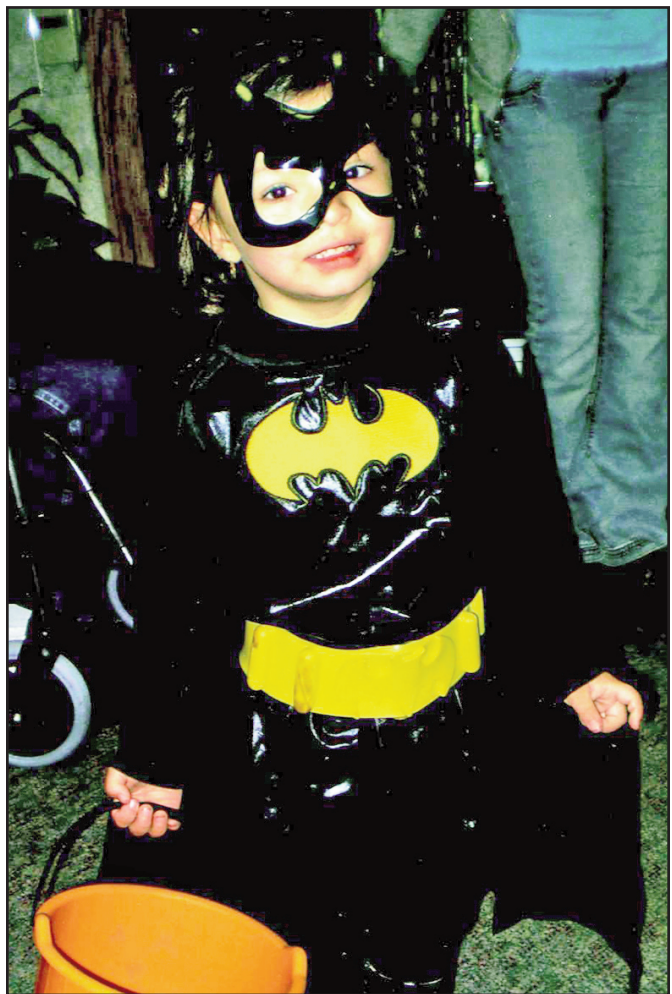

**Texico coach Glynnna Martin resigns**

The Texico School Board on Monday received the resignation of teacher and coach Glynnna Martin, effective Nov. 16.

She is moving to Bushland, Texas, where she will teach physical education and coach JV basketball and JV volleyball.

It is unsure at this point whether Texico will hire another teacher – coach, or try to use existing personnel. This is because of pending budget cutbacks due to receiving less state funds. The amount of the cutbacks still awaits final state decisions to be signed by Gov. Richardson.

A Texico school committee has been set up to look at budget cutbacks.

In other business, the board:

-- Accepted a bid from K Barnett for expanding the baseball field parking lot. A state grant is paying for this.

-- Received a report on the successful school auction. The pre-school building is in the process of being moved.

The school board will meet on Nov. 23 for a special meeting and could accept a bid from the most responsible responsive bidder (the legal language)

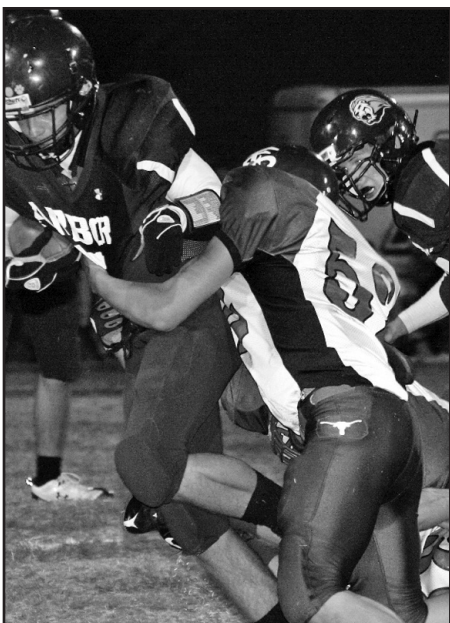

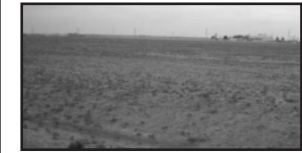

In the domestic science contest were: Farwell - Martha Kulfman, Joe De Olivera, Martha Wulfman and May Smith.

Page 3, as usual, featured a full page ad for the ill-fated Cannon Ball Motor Co., which turned out to be a scam.

Page 4 had a half-page ad for the C.A. Roberson Brokerage firm, which needed sales reps.

There also was a large ad for the Mountain States Telephone & Telegraph Co. explaining why rates needed to go up.

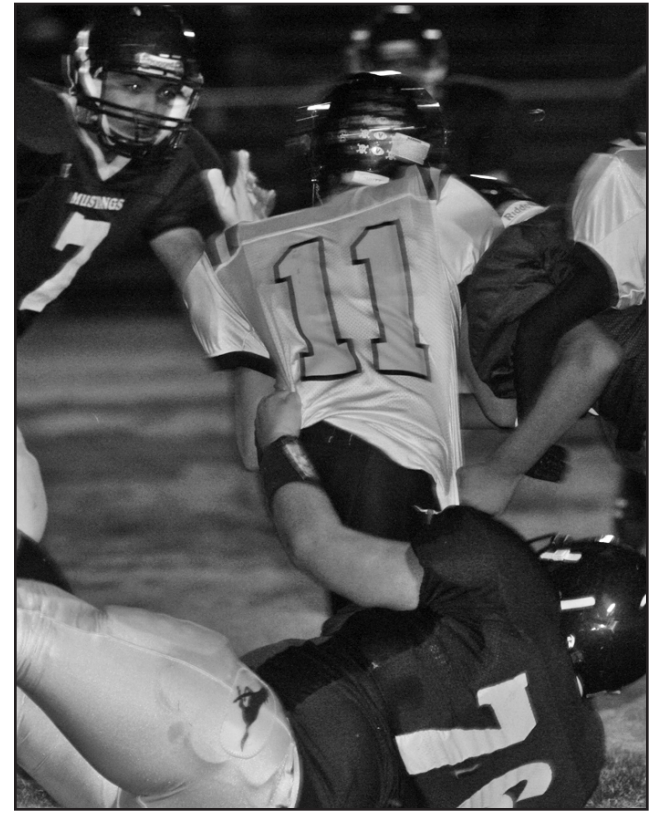
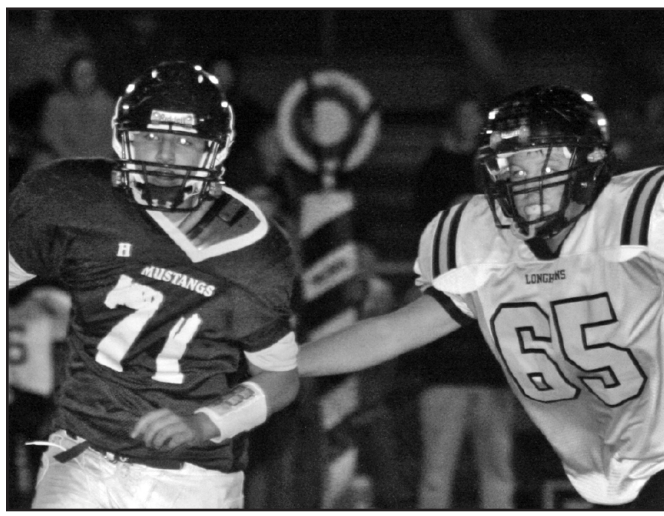

Bovina is home to a new granite countertop business – Allied Countertop at the corner of Hwy. 86 and 3rd Street.

Josue Gonzales, of Bovina, and Jorge Mascareno, of Clovis, have been measuring, cutting and installing countertops for the last several years, and have worked for Lowe's, Home Depot, and other companies.

They install kitchen and bathroom countertops as well as other applications. They also have experience with residential as well as commercial projects.

Josue, son of Micky and Delmira Gonzales, of Bovina, said they went into business after he saw a job Mascareno had done. The two now have done counters around a 100 mile radius from Bovina.

Gonzales said they can get the same materials that Lowe's and Home Depot use, but they don't charge mileage like the big stores do. That will generally save consumers more than they realize. In one case, he said mileage can sometimes cost as much as the counters.

The jobs generally take 2-3 weeks from measurement to fabrication and installation.

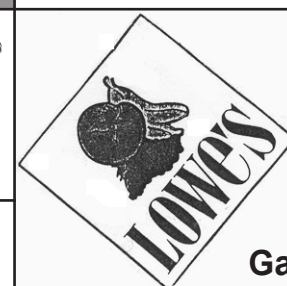
