Texico beats Estancia; seeded 4th in State playoffs

Texico's Wolverines edged Estancia in the final district game, 28-24 victory, after a scoreless first half.
Texico, 8-1 on the season and 2-1 in district, was given a No. 4 seed in the 12 -team Class 2A state bracket. This means they get a first-round bye this weekend.
But next week, they will face either New Mexico Military Academy, seeded 12th, or Estancia again. Estancia is seeded 5 th.
The Wolverines rallied and put big numbers on the board with 4 TDs and PATs in the 3rd quarter. Estancia answered with 24 points of their own in the 4th, gaining momentum after scoring on the first play with a 50 -yard pass.
Estancia started the game at its 22 on a tackle by Matt Vasquez. Jonathan Hill had a tackle for minus 5. Marques Pena broke up a pass play, and
Rivera's tackle forced a punt to the Texico 39 .

Edgardo Meza gained 12. A penalty moved the ball
o Estancia's 36. Meza rushed for 15 behind the excellent blocking of Sean Rusk, Jairo Lozano and Pena, but a holding penalty and short gains on the Wolverines stopped the drive at the Bears' 22.
Pena's interception stopped Estancia's drive at the Texico's 20. Texico was held and punted, Donovan Johnson and Pena interfered with Bears' passes, and Brandon King ha a QB sack for minus
Texico started at its 16. Meza gained a first own, then ran for 18 behind the blocking of Humburto Burciaga, Vasquez, and Garrett Garrison. The drive stalled and Texico again punted
Donovan Johnson tackled the returner at Texico's 44. Jose Posada intercepted and Texico got the ball back at its 40 . Estancia rose up and stopped the olverines again.
